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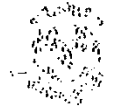

And the facts establishing the grounds for issuing a Search and Seizure Warrant are the following:

1. That the affiant Detective James McGlynn, #1268 is a regular sworn member of the Connecticut State Police Department and has been a member of said Department for the past 23 years having participated in numerous criminal investigations, which have led to arrests and convictions. That the affiant McGlynn is presently assigned to the State Police Central District Major Crime Squad.
2. That the affiant Detective Scott Wisner, #507 is a regular sworn member of the Connecticut State Police Department and has been a member of said Department for the past 20 years having participated in numerous criminal investigations, which have led to arrests and convictions. That the affiant Wisner is presently assigned to the State Police Central District Major Crime Squad.
3. That on Friday, 12/14/12, at approximately 0935 hours, Newtown Police Department received a 911 call from a caller at the Sandy Hook Elementary School, 12 Dickinson Drive in Newtown, CT. The caller reported that an active shooting situation was occurring at the Sandy Hook Elementary School.
4. That as a result of the 911 call, numerous law enforcement personnel including members from the Newtown Police Department and the Connecticut State Police responded to Sandy Hook Elementary School, in Newtown. Upon arrival, law enforcement personnel conducted a search of the interior and exterior of the school. Investigators located CT registration 872YEO, a 2010, black colored Honda Civic unoccupied and parked in the fire lane directly in front of the school. A shotgun was noted in plain view to be in the interior of the vehicle. The registered owner for the Honda Civic is Nancy Lanza, DOB 09/06/60, 36 Yogananda Street in Sandy Hook, CT.
5. That as investigators entered the school numerous school children and school personnel were located deceased from apparent gunshot wounds in the first three classrooms located off the main hallway, adjacent to the school's front entrance. That investigators also located a teenaged white male dressed in military style clothing, wearing a bullet proof vest lying deceased on the floor in the middle classroom. That the deceased male was in possession of several handguns as well as a military style assault weapon. That the deceased male has been tentatively identified as Adam Lanza, DOB 04/22/92, who resides at 36 Yogananda Street in Sandy Hook, CT.
6. That law enforcement personnel including members of the Connecticut State Police, Emergency Service Unit, responded to the residence of Nancy Lanza at 36 Yogananda Street in Sandy Hook, CT. Upon arrival at Lanza's residence, Connecticut State Police Emergency Service Unit gained entry into the house and located a deceased middle aged white female lying in a supine position on a bed in the 2nd floor master bedroom. The white female sustained an apparent gunshot wound to her forehead. Investigators located a rifle on the floor near the bed. The deceased white female is presumed Nancy Lanza, DOB 09/06/60.
7. That 12/14/12, Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation interviewed [REDACTED] [REDACTED] rarely leaves his home and considers him to be a shut in and an avid gamer who plays Call of Duty, amongst other games. [REDACTED] has a gun safe containing at least four guns. [REDACTED] had attended Sandy Hook Elementary School and that the school was Adam Lanza's "life."
8. That the Affiants have personal knowledge, based upon their experience and training, that crimes of

violence involve a struggle, a break, the use of weapons and other instrumentalities, and/or the element of unpredictability; the person or persons participating in the commission of a violent crime is/are in contact with physical surroundings in a forceful or otherwise detectable manner; there is often an attempt to alter, destroy, remove, clean up, or cover up evidence of a crime. That traces may be left in the form of blood, semen, saliva, physiological fluids and secretions, hair, fibers, fingerprints, palm prints, footprints, shoe prints, weapons and firearms including pistols, rifles, revolvers, shotguns, knives, hatchets, axes, cutting instruments and cutting tools, blunt force instruments, projectiles, ammunition, bullet casings and fragments, gunshot residue (GSR), dirt, dust and soil, paint samples, glass and plastic fragments, marks of tools used to gain access to locked premises or containers and items containing traces of any of the above mentioned articles. Many of the above items are minute and/or microscopic, thus requiring additional specialized examination by forensic science laboratory techniques, such as that performed by the Connecticut State Police Forensic Science Laboratory.

9. That the Affiants also have personal knowledge, based upon their experience and training, that a crime scene, such as described above, will contain physical evidence, hereinbefore itemized, which will aid in establishing the identity of the perpetrator(s), the circumstances under which the crime was committed, and/or which in general will assist in the discovery of the pertinent facts and that such evidence requires a systematic search to locate, seize, record and process. That trace evidence left in the forms mentioned above is easily transferred between participants and inanimate objects such as surroundings, including their motor vehicle. That it is reasonable to believe and expect that a person responsible for committing a crime, such as the one described in this affidavit would come in contact with these forms of trace evidence and transfer them to their surroundings.
10. That the Affiants also have personal knowledge that the Department of Public Safety Forensic Science Laboratory located at 278 Colony St in Meriden, CT has the equipment, personnel and expertise necessary to conduct physical examination, scientific testing and forensic analysis, including but not limited to biological and chemical testing, instrumental analysis, firearms, photography, biochemistry, DNA, criminalistics, fingerprints, in order to locate, identify, compare and reconstruct items of evidence and trace evidence to aid in establishing the circumstances of the crime and identity of the participants involved in the crime. The Department of Public Safety Forensic Science Laboratory will use standardized and documented procedures to extract, amplify and detect DNA from evidentiary items and samples taken from known individuals. The resulting DNA profiles from the evidentiary items will be compared to the known individuals' profiles and the results documented in a laboratory report.
11. That based upon the facts and circumstances described above, your Affiants have probable cause to believe that evidence of the crime of murder, in violation of Connecticut General Statute 53a-54c, will be found within Connecticut registration 872YEO, a 2010 Honda Civic, 4-door sedan color black, vin #2HGFA1F51AH542299, registered to Nancy Lanza, DOB 09/06/30 of 36 Yogananda Street in Sandy Hook, Connecticut.
12. Therefore, the Affiants are requesting a Search and Seizure warrant be issued for Connecticut registration 872YEO, a 2010 Honda Civic, 4-door sedan color black, vin #2HGFA1F51AH542299, registered to Nancy Lanza, DOB 09/06/30 of 36 Yogananda Street in Sandy Hook, Connecticut.

3. That on Friday, 12/14/12, at approximately 0935 hours, Newtown Police Department received a 911 call from a caller at the Sandy Hook Elementary School, 12 Dickinson Drive in Newtown, CT. The caller reported that an active shooting situation was occurring at the Sandy Hook Elementary School.
4. That as a result of the 911 call, numerous law enforcement personnel including members from the Newtown Police Department and the Connecticut State Police responded to Sandy Hook Elementary School, in Newtown. Upon arrival, law enforcement personnel conducted a search of the interior and exterior of the school. Investigators located CT registration 872YEO, a 2010, black colored Honda Civic unoccupied and parked in the fire lane directly in front of the school. The registered owner for the Honda Civic is Nancy Lanza, DOB 09/06/60, 36 Yogananda Street in Sandy Hook, CT.
5. That as investigators entered the school numerous school children and school personnel were located deceased from apparent gunshot wounds in the first three classrooms located off the main hallway, adjacent to the school's front entrance. That investigators also located a teenaged white male dressed in military style clothing, wearing a bullet proof vest lying deceased on the floor in the middle classroom. That the deceased male was in possession of several handguns as well as a military style assault weapon.

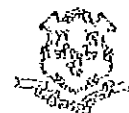

1. That the affiant Detective James McGlynn, #1268 is a regular sworn member of the Connecticut State Police Department and has been a member of said Department for the past 23 years having participated in numerous criminal investigations, which have led to arrests and convictions. 

investigators seized various items of evidentiary value. Among these items were personal computers and electronic equipment that would provide the user with a means of communication via the Internet. Sepulveda Boulevard, Suite 300, in El Segundo, California 90245**. Combat Arms has over 10,000,000 registered players. The game supports community features such as Clans, Internet Relay Chat (IRC), and an in-game Friends' List. Combat Arms uses a player ranking system based on total experience, using common military ranks that players can obtain. Completing objectives, killing other players, and leveling up one's rank gives the player money in the form of Gear Points (GP) that can then be used to purchase new equipment. Equipment includes weaponry, weapon attachments, and accessories for one's character. Players can also purchase equipment from the Black Market (previously known as the Nexon Cash Shop) using Nexon Cash (NX) that is bought with real-world money.
11. Further review of the aforementioned screenshots, revealed an online gaming account / character with the associated gamer tag, "**KAYNBRED**". A gamer tag is a name (usually a pseudonym) adopted by a video gamer and used as the individual's preferred identification method within the gaming community. In this case, it appears that KAYNBRED was the sole gamer tag utilized when logging on / playing Combat Arms from this computer.
12. The gamer tag, KAYNBRED, also possessed a "clan tag", which is a unique marker, image, or symbol, used to identify that the gamer is a member of a specific clan. Clans are generally a group of gamers who play together as a team against other clans. They are most commonly found in online multi-player games in which one team can face off against another. Clans can also be formed to create loosely based affiliations perhaps by all being fans of the same game or merely gamers who have close personal ties to each other. FPS clans normally host servers with rules that they like. For instance, if a group of gamers like to use pistols only, they could join a clan that runs a pistols only server and the clan would enforce the rules. So, it is important to join a clan that has server rules you enjoy or you could easily find yourself removed from the clan. KAYNBRED was a member of clan "**MG14c**". Additional information depicted within the screenshots, noted twenty-two (22) other gamer tags to be associated with clan MG14c as well as snippets of chat content corresponding (to and from) with KAYNBRED and other members of MG14c.
13. The definition of Internet Relay Chat (IRC) is a protocol for live interactive Internet text messaging (chat) or synchronous conferencing. It is mainly designed for group communication in discussion forums, called channels but also allows one-to-one communication via private message as well as chat and data transfer including file sharing. Combat Arms affords its users the following four (4) means of IRC from which to communicate while gaming: "All Chat", "Clan Chat Only", "Channel Chat", and a "Community Forum".

And the facts establishing the grounds for issuing a Search and Seizure Warrant are the following:

1. That the undersigned Affiants, Detective Christopher Allegro #950 and Detective John Kimball #877, are members of the Connecticut State Police, presently assigned to the Western District Major Crime Squad (WDMCS) and have approximately 28 years of combined law enforcement experience. Both Affiants have conducted numerous investigations of criminal activity including, but not limited to, murder, sexual assaults, kidnapping, robberies, narcotics violations, and assaults and have received specialized training in the processing of crime scenes and the collection of physical and trace evidence. The knowledge of the facts and circumstances contained hereinafter are the result of the Affiants' personal investigative efforts and observations, as well as those of other law enforcement officers acting in their official capacity, who related their findings to these Affiants.
2. On Friday December 14th, 2012 at approximately 0935 hours, Newtown Police Department Dispatch received a 9-1-1 call from a caller at the Sandy Hook Elementary School located at 12 Dickinson Drive in Newtown, Connecticut. The caller reported that an active shooting situation was occurring at the Sandy Hook Elementary School.
3. As a result of the 9-1-1 call, numerous law enforcement personnel, including members from the Newtown Police Department and the Connecticut State Police, responded to the Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown. Upon arrival, law enforcement personnel conducted a search of the interior and exterior of the school. Investigators located Connecticut registration 872YEO, a 2010 black-colored Honda Civic, unoccupied and parked near the fire lane directly in front of the school. The registered owner for the Honda Civic is Nancy Lanza, year of birth - 1960, of 36 Yogananda Street in Newtown, Connecticut.
4. As investigators entered the school, numerous children and school personnel were located deceased within the school. Investigators also located a white male dressed in military style clothing, lying deceased on the floor in room 10. The deceased male was in possession of several firearms. The deceased male has been positively identified as Adam Lanza, year of birth - 1992, hereinafter referred to as "the shooter", who resided at 36 Yogananda Street in Newtown, Connecticut.
5. Law enforcement personnel, including members of the Connecticut State Police - Emergency Service Unit, responded to the residence of Nancy Lanza at 36 Yogananda Street in Newtown, Connecticut. Upon arrival at Lanza's residence, members of the Connecticut State Police - Emergency Service Unit gained entry into the house and located a deceased middle-aged white female lying on a bed in the 2nd floor master bedroom. The white female sustained an apparent gunshot wound to her forehead. The deceased female was positively identified as Nancy Lanza, year of birth - 1960.
6. On Thursday December 14th, 2012, law enforcement agents interviewed a witness who knew Adam Lanza and stated the he rarely left his home and considered him to be a shut-in. The witness also stated that "the shooter" has a gun safe containing at least four guns. The witness also stated that "the shooter" had attended the Sandy Hook Elementary School.
7. On Thursday December 14th, 2012 a Search and Seizure Warrant (Mincey) was applied for and granted for the residence located at 36 Yogananda Street in Newtown, Connecticut. The Search and Seizure Warrant was authorized by the Honorable John F. Blawie.

investigators seized various items of evidentiary value. Among these items were personal computers and electronic equipment that would provide the user with a means of communication via the Internet. "The shooter" resided at this address with his mother (Nancy Lanza) and would have had access to all the aforementioned items.

9. Through investigative efforts conducted by other law enforcement officers including but not limited to detailed interviews with relatives of "the shooter" and the comprehensive review of items of evidentiary value, these Affiants learned that "the shooter" played the online game, "World of Warcraft (WoW)", and that the relatives had paid for the subscription. Also, that one of the computer hard drives located within the Lanza residence (36 Yogananda Street) contained an electronic folder labeled "videos". Within this folder were three (3) video files of recorded game play of World of Warcraft (WoW). These files were named: "blarvink", "gnome", and "gnomecompressed".
10. An Internet search for World of Warcraft (WoW) revealed it to be a "Massively Multiplayer Online Role-Playing Game (MMORPG)" hosted by Blizzard Entertainment, Inc. located at 16215 Alton Parkway in Irvine, California 92618. With over 7 million subscribers as of July 2013, World of Warcraft is currently the world's most-subscribed MMORPG and holds the Guinness World Record for the most popular MMORPG by subscribers. Additionally, in World of Warcraft the user controls an avatar (usually a pseudonym), which is the graphical representation of the user or the user's alter ego or character within the game. World of Warcraft also requires the user to pay for a subscription, either by buying prepaid game cards for selected amount of playing time, or by using a credit or debit card to pay on a regular basis.
11. Further review of the aforementioned videos, revealed an online gaming account / character with the associated avatar, "blarvink". In this case, it appears that blarvink was the sole avatar utilized when logging on / playing World of Warcraft (WoW) from this computer.
12. World of Warcraft supports gaming community features such as Guilds, Internet Relay Chat (IRC), and an in-game Friends List / Real ID Friends List. Guilds are generally a group of gamers who play together as a team against other guilds. They are most commonly found in online multi-player games in which one team can face off against another. Guilds can also be formed to create loosely based affiliations perhaps by all being fans of the same game or merely gamers who have close personal ties to each other. Guilds normally host servers with rules that they like. For instance, if a group of gamers like to use magical spells only, they could join a guild that runs a spells only server and the guild would enforce the rules. So, it is important to join a guild that has server rules you enjoy or you could easily find yourself removed from the guild.
13. The definition of Internet Relay Chat (IRC) is a protocol for live interactive Internet text messaging (chat) or synchronous conferencing. It is mainly designed for group communication in discussion forums, called channels but also allows one-to-one communication via private message as well as chat and data transfer including file sharing. World of Warcraft affords its users the following four (4) means of IRC from which to communicate while gaming: "Chat Channels", "Custom Channel (user created for privacy)", "Voice Chat", and "Other Chat". Not to mention, various public blogging forums and game-related discussion boards.
14. Based on the Affiants' training and experience, a perpetrator(s), or persons knowing the victim(s), may have communicated by way of Internet Relay Chat (IRC) while participating in virtual communities, including but not limited to Internet-based MMORPG games. Also, any co-conspirators in the planning, execution, and/or cover up of a particular crime may have communicated by way of IRC. Additionally, persons who communicate or attempt to communicate in this manner may have knowledge or valuable information leading to the

***The following is only intended to be a summary of the events that occurred on December 14, 2012, including excerpts of conversations contained on "911" calls and radio transmissions. This summary is not inclusive of every word recorded.*

The following summary also includes descriptions of some images retrieved from mobile video recorders that were deemed to be pertinent to this investigation, and images described in this timeline are not inclusive of every image seen on the videos.

The programmed times on several mobile video recorders were found to have been set incorrectly. For the purpose of this summary, those times have been corrected to reflect the actual time as determined by utilizing accurately documented communications from the dispatch center and now correlate with the times of the dispatch centers and properly set mobile video recorders.

09:30:00 The front door at Sandy Hook Elementary, hereinafter referred to as SHES, is locked. Entry to SHES is made by being buzzed in by the main office personnel. (██████████'s Statement)

09:30:00 Parent ██████████ arrives at SHES for the gingerbread house event and has to be buzzed into SHES. At around 9:34, ████████ hears gunfire, reports approx 15 shots. (██████████ Statement)

09:35:00 Parent ████████████████████ arrives at SHES. While walking from the parking lot, he notices nine (9) children (room 10) running down the sidewalk in front of SHES. He recognizes one of the children. (██████████'s Statement)

9:35:39 –First call received to Newtown Police on 911 from ██████████: Caller (██████████) reports she saw the shooter. ██████████ makes the call from the nurse's office after the shooter left the office. (██████████ Statement)

██████████: "██████████." –
call lasts 24 seconds.

09:35:43 ██████████ – First 911 call to the CSP Centralized Dispatch (CSP Centralized Dispatch 911 call)

09:35:56 Newtown Police Officers inside the police department are informed of the shooting at SHES and immediately leave the police department. (Newtown PD surveillance video)

09:36:00 As ██████████ arrives to the covered patio at the front of SHES, he hears gunfire inside the school and notices that the front entrance window is shot out. He calls 911 and runs down the sidewalk in the front of the school toward the playscape (east side) of school to ██████████'s classroom. ██████████ (No record of 911 call connecting) (██████████'s Statement)

09:36:06 Newtown Police Dispatch broadcasts that there is a shooting at SHES. (Newtown radio)

9:36:06 Dispatcher Nute: "67 (Officer McGowan) Sandy Hook School caller is indicating she thinks there is someone shooting in building."

9:36:13 – ██████████ 911 call is transferred to Newtown Police. (Newtown 911 calls)

9:36:25 Officer Seabrook hears the broadcast and is enroute to SHES from the Newtown/Monroe line. (Officer Seabrook's video)

9:36:38 Newtown Sgt Kullgren hears broadcast and is enroute to SHES: (Newtown radio)

Newtown Sgt Kullgren: "S6, I am enroute."

██████████ arrives at SHES and sees the 9 children running from the school. At the time that she saw the children, she was at the stop sign of Dickinson Drive and the school parking lot. (██████████ Statement)

██████████ walks to the front door of SHES and sees that the front window is shot out. She hears gunfire in the school. (██████████ Statement)

██████████ arrives at SHES shortly after ██████████. She also sees the children running near the stop sign. Both women meet at the front door and upon hearing gunfire, run to the dumpsters on the west side of the school to hide. (██████████'s Statement)

9:37:40 Newtown Sgt Kullgren gives instructions to Newtown officers responding to the scene: (Newtown radio)

Newtown Sgt Kullgren: “S6 to 95(Officer Seabrook) , 67 (Officer McGowan) if you come up the rear of the school, on that Crestwood the back road, the other units will take a staging point in the driveway.”

09:38:00 [REDACTED] calls 911. Telephone call received at centralized dispatch by CSP Sgt Roach. [REDACTED] tells Sgt Roach that she is at Sandy Hook School and someone is shooting guns. She tells Sgt Roach that she is injured in the foot. (CSP Centralized Dispatch 911)

9:38:07 [REDACTED] reports that he is still hearing gunshots: (Newtown 911)

9:38:23 [REDACTED] reports that he no longer hears shooting: (Newtown 911)

09:38:24 Sgt Bahamonde is driving on Church Hill Rd enroute to SHES from the police department. The cruiser in front is Officer Penna. (Sgt Bahamonde’s video)

CSP Sgt Cario: “Start all our western patrols that way. Patrol one (1) slide down to the highway and the eastern patrols cover the rest.”

09:38:43 [REDACTED] – parent in conference room #9, calls 911 and it is answered by CSP Dispatcher LaPrade. [REDACTED] tells Dispatcher LaPrade that she is in a conference room with five (5) adults and one has been shot twice. [REDACTED] tells Dispatcher LaPrade that she believes that the shooter is right outside the door and that the shooter has already shot a hundred times. (CSP Centralized Dispatch 911)

9:41:07 Information is relayed as to the possible location of the shooting within SHES: (Newtown radio)

Newtown Sgt Kullgren: *"Responding units , last known gunshots were in the front of the building."*

9:41:47 CSP Deskman Loomis: *"Any cars still responding, the shooter is apparently still in the main office area."* (CSP radio)

9:41:24 Officer McGowan has [REDACTED] prone out on the playground of SHES. First time that information is relayed that there is possibly a second shooter: (Newtown radio)

09:41:24 Officer McGowan: *"I need a unit up here, on the playground side, to secure this party."*

9:41:30 Newtown Sgt Kullgren: *"Do you have that person yes, no?"*

9:41:34 Officer McGowan: *"I don't know, I've got a party on the side, I have him prone out now."*

9:41:39 Newtown Sgt Kullgren: *"Roger that, units be aware that we could have a secondary unit."*

Officer McGowan's transmission draws the attention of the Newtown officers on scene. Officers Chapman and Smith respond from the south side (rear) of the school. traveled in a southeast direction then curving to a southwest direction to the large parking lot at the front (northeast) side of the school. Dickinson Drive proceeded up to the school in a slight incline with the incline ending at the point when the roadway reaches the north side of the school. Dickinson Drive connects the parking lots and Riverside Road. Dickinson Drive allows traffic to travel to and from the Sandy Hook Elementary School. Dickinson Drive is approximately 1234 feet long from the point it reaches the school to the intersection with Riverside Road. At the intersection of Dickinson Drive and Riverside Road was the Sandy Hook Volunteer Fire and Rescue Company (18 Riverside Road).

According to Vision Appraisal, the property of Sandy Hook Elementary School was a 1 story brick veneer public school owned by the town of Newtown. This building was 66,027 square feet and is built in 1954. On the south side of the school there was an added portable classroom. There were approximately 21 access doors located around the school, including a garage door. Refer to the Connecticut State Police Crash Analysis Reconstruction Squad (CARS) supplemental scene diagram for exact exterior dimensions and locations of the school, parking lot and Dickinson Drive. Refer to Detective Keith's scene report for a detailed description of the interior of the school.

The school building was positioned with its front entrance patio and lobby area facing in a magnetic northeast direction, however for report purposes NORTH will be designated as the front of the school. The front entrance faces in a northerly direction with a parking lot directly in front of the main entrance of the building. The front entrance of the school proceeds to a concrete patio and then leads directly to the parking lot. Adjacent to both sides of the concrete patio were mulch areas with assorted plantings, which were located in front of the windows on the north side of the school. Refer to Detective Keith's scene report for a detailed description of the patio area. The suspect's vehicle, a 2010 black Honda Civic bearing Connecticut registration 872YEO, VIN# 2HGFA1F51AH542299, was located in front of the main entrance of the Sandy Hook Elementary School, parked in a no parking zone nearest the northwest corner of the building. The suspect's vehicle was approximately 94 feet and 11 inches from the main entrance. The parking lot consisted of four rows of parking spaces. At the northeast end of the parking lot, there was an extended portion of the parking lot that provided four additional rows of parking spaces. The total number of parking spaces for the parking lot was 136. Three vehicles were identified in the parking lot of the school to have sustained bullet strikes during the incident. The three vehicles were located nearest to the north side classrooms of the school and they are as follows:

It was reported that during the initial response to the incident, the southern exterior door's window was breached by police to gain entry through the eastern side of the building. Directly adjacent to the eastern side of the school was an emergency access asphalt road. Directly adjacent to that was a sand playground area used for the school children. North of the playground area was a grass soccer field. North of the soccer field was a grass baseball field. The eastern side of the school was surrounded by a fence that separated it from the wooded area and Crestwood Drive. The fence extended along the wood line from the baseball field south and then wrapped around the southern side of the school. The fence ended at the southwestern corner of the school where it abuts a wooded hillside that extended along the western side of the school.

Adjacent to the south side of the school was a basketball court located west of the portable classroom. South of the portable classroom was a small grass baseball field. Beyond that was the fence mentioned above that separates the school and the Crestwood Drive residential area.

Directly adjacent to the western side of the building was an emergency access asphalt road. Directly adjacent to that was shed and utility area. To the west of that area was a wooded hillside that surrounded the school extending to the northern side of the building. This wooded hillside separated the school and the residential houses located on Riverside Road.

Evidence:

During the course of this investigation, the Connecticut State Police Central District Major Crime Squad processed the above listed scene and seized five (5) items of evidence. The evidence seized consisted of two C-Sport brand black zipper up hooded sweatshirts (Exhibits #500 and #501). The sweatshirts were located in the Sandy Hook Elementary School parking lot on the pavement next to the suspect's vehicle (a black 2010 Honda Civic, CT registration 872YEO). Additionally, an Intergriswab swabbing was taken of a red blood like substance that was found on the pavement of the Sandy Hook Elementary School parking lot (Exhibit #502) for the purposes of identifying a potential DNA source. The red blood like substance was located next to a white Subaru bearing New York registration [REDACTED], which was parked in the northeast side of the

parking lot. One S&B 60 56x45 live ammunition round (Exhibit #503) was located on the pavement in the Sandy Hook Elementary School parking lot next to the suspect's vehicle. One twelve gauge live shotgun ammunition round (Exhibit #504) was located on the pavement of the Sandy Hook Elementary School parking lot. The twelve gauge round was located next to the dark gray Subaru bearing Connecticut registration [REDACTED] which was parked on the north side of the parking lot. All evidence items are detailed on separate evidence report. Refer to the Connecticut State Police Crash Analysis Reconstruction Squad (CARS) supplemental scene diagram for exact locations of the evidence items seized.

Evidence items five hundred (500) through five hundred and four (504) were turned over to Detective Keith of WDMC on December 15, 2012 approximately 0008 hours.

Action Taken:

On Friday, December 14, 2012 at approximately 1000 hours, investigators of the Central District Major Crime Squad were requested by the Western District Major Crime Squad to assist with the exterior scene processing of the Sandy Hook Elementary School located at 12 Dickinson Drive in Sandy Hook, Connecticut.

Scene processing consisted of investigators completing an exterior scene diagram (CARS Unit), documenting the exterior scene with video, primary digital photography, secondary digital photography, and examining the entire exterior scene for items of evidentiary value. Processing began at approximately 1500 hours and ended at approximately 2330 hours on December 14, 2012. Additional scene processing was also conducted on December 17, 2012 between 1500 hours on 1645 hours as well as on December 18, 2012 between 1000 hours and 1500 hours.

On December 14, 2012, investigators conducted a systematic search of the scene. Investigators identified the suspect's vehicle, a 2010 black Honda Civic bearing Connecticut

registration 872YEO, VIN# 2HGFA1F51AH542299, which located in front of the main entrance of the Sandy Hook Elementary School, parked in a no parking zone. Prior to investigators searching the suspect's vehicle, members of the Emergency Services Unit (ESU) conducted a cursory search of the vehicle and located a weapon (later seized as Exhibit #505) in the back seat of the suspect's vehicle. That weapon was moved to the locked trunk area of the suspect's vehicle for safety reasons. The suspect's vehicle was processed at a later date under the legal authority of a Search and Seizure Warrant. Refer to the supplemental vehicle processing report for details regarding the vehicle processing and the evidence that was seized from within it. Investigators identified two (2) C-Sport brand black zipper up hooded sweatshirts (Exhibits #500 and #501) located on the pavement adjacent to the suspect's vehicle. Investigators then identified one (1) S&B 60 56x45 live ammunition round (Exhibit #503), which was also located on the pavement adjacent to the suspect's vehicle.

During the search, a red blood like substance was located next to a white Subaru bearing New York registration [REDACTED], which was parked in the northeast side of the parking lot. An Integriswab swabbing was taken of the red blood like substance (Exhibit #502) for the purposes of identifying a potential DNA source. One twelve gauge live shotgun ammunition round (Exhibit #504) was located on the pavement of the parking lot. The twelve gauge round was located next to the dark gray Subaru bearing Connecticut registration [REDACTED], which was parked on the north side of the parking lot.


Evidence items five hundred (500) through five hundred and four (504) were turned over to Detective Keith of WDMC on December 15, 2012 approximately 0008 hours.

While continuing the systematic search of the exterior of the school on December 14, 2012, investigators observed a grouping of suspected bullet strikes within the glass and metal glass framing on the north wall of classroom 10. This wall abuts the school's parking lot. All suspected bullet strikes were documented with photography in digital format, as well as being located with measurements taken by the Connecticut State Police Crash Analysis Reconstruction Squad (CARS). Refer to the supplemental Bullet Strike report and the CARS scene diagram.

A further search of the parking lot area lead investigators to identify three (3) vehicles that had sustained suspected bullet strikes during the incident. The vehicles were located in the first and second row of the parking lot nearest the north side of the building. Refer to the supplemental CARS scene diagram for further details with regards to the vehicle locations. The following is a list of the vehicles with suspected bullet strikes:



On Sunday, December 16, 2012 the above mentioned vehicles were processed by investigators. Processing consisted of investigators documenting the vehicle with video, digital photography, completing a motor vehicle survey, performing bullet strike analysis / trajectory and examining the interior and exterior of the vehicle for bullet projectiles as well as any other items of evidentiary value. Prior to the vehicles being returned to the owners, a secondary exterior search was conducted by investigators with negative findings for additional items of evidentiary value. Refer to the supplemental vehicle processing and bullet strike reports for the details regarding the vehicle processings and the evidence that was seized from the vehicles.

On December 17, 2012, investigators performed a cursory search of the mulch and plant area located on the north side of the school. The search yielded negative results. Then on December 18, 2012, investigators performed a systematic search of the mulch and plant area adjacent to the front entrance concrete patio, which was located in front of the windows on the north side of the school. Investigators raked out the mulch beds and plant area, utilized metal detectors and removed some plantings during the search. Investigators efforts yielded negative results for items of evidentiary value. It should be noted that WDMC previously processed the front entrance concrete patio area, which yielded the recovery of numerous expended shell casings. Refer to WDMC Detective Sliby's scene report for a detailed description of the items of evidentiary value that were seized from the front entrance patio area.

The patio area had a roof covering and shrubbery plantings in the center portion of the patio. The shrubbery plantings were located west of the main entrance doors and north of the lobby windows.

The main entrance consisted of two locked full glass doors that were both hinged on the east side and opened outwardly using a pull handle. These doors were secured with an electronic locking mechanism and require the door to be unlocked electronically or opened from the inside. The doors could be opened from the inside with a Safety Door Exit Device with Extruded Aluminum Mechanism Housing (push bar). This push bar design was mounted horizontally across the middle portion of the door. These doors provided access to a vestibule. There are two locked doors on the south side of the vestibule that provide access into the lobby of the school. These two doors were similar to the entrance doors with full glass, hinge on the east side and a push bar design. The vestibule was made up of a cinderblock wall on the east side that was also the west wall with classroom #12. There were three (3) full length windows on the west side and the two entrance doors to the lobby on the south side of the vestibule.

On the exterior side of the main entrance doorway, adjacent to the west side of the west entrance door to the vestibule, was a "call box" buzzer system with a video camera. [REDACTED] stated that this call box was installed seven (7) years ago, 2005, and confirmed that the video camera does not record. The call box video is viewed live on three (3) monitoring systems located on the three (3) secretary desks in the main office with no recording capabilities. The electronic unlocking of the front doors is done by using a "key button" on any of the three (3) monitoring systems. (For further details refer to Det. Mudry's Nexgen Report #74667)

Adjacent to the west side of the front entrance doors were six (6) large pane glass windows that made up the north wall of the lobby area. The large pane windows measured individually approximately 85 1/2 inches high and 49 inches wide. The large pane of glass immediately adjacent to the west side of the west main entrance door was broken with a large oval shaped opening in the glass. This broken area in the glass measured approximately 35 1/3 inches wide and 42 1/2 inches high. Glass shards were located on the patio and plantings in the area adjacent to the north side (outside) of the glass window area and also on the tile floor in the lobby. **Eight (8) expended brass colored casings**, each with the head stamp "S&B 60 5.56x45", were located in the patio area just north of the broken window and front entrance doors. These casings were seized as Exhibit #5 and Exhibit #94.

LOBBY

The lobby measured approximately 28 feet north to south and 36 feet east to west. The lobby was accessed upon entry into the school from the main entrance on the north side of the school. The southeast corner of the lobby allowed open access to

the north hallway of the school. The southwest corner of the lobby allowed open access to the west hallway of the school. The cafeteria could be accessed through a door on the west wall of the lobby. This door opened into the lobby. The cafeteria door was wooden and had a circular window in the upper portion of the door. This door was found in the open position. The kitchen of the cafeteria could be accessed through a door on the west wall of the lobby, north of the cafeteria doors. This door had no window and was found in the open position. The main office could be accessed from a door on the south wall of the lobby. This office door was comprised of solid wood with a narrow vertical window located to the east side and upper portion of the door. There were four large square windows with four small rectangular windows above them on the south wall of the lobby (north wall of the office). These windows were located east of the office entrance door. Each window and the door window of the office were comprised of diamond wire glass. There was a long brown wooden bench located under the windows of the office on the south wall of the lobby.

The floor in the lobby was made up of square two foot by two foot black, brown and white porcelain tile. The lobby ceiling was approximately 8 feet high. The walls were comprised of white painted cinder block over tan colored tile with a blue painted divide between them. The lower portion of the wall was approximately 4 feet 7 inches of tan colored tile and the upper portion was approximately 3 feet four inches of white painted cinder block. **Sixteen (16) brass colored expended bullet casings**, bearing the head stamp "S&B 60 5.56x45", were located on the floor and within the lobby area. The expended casings were seized as Exhibit #6.

Adjacent to the south side of the north windows in the lobby were assorted display cases, magazine racks and furniture. In the center west side of the lobby area was a wood table with six (6) wood framed with blue cushioned chairs. Adjacent to the east side of the lobby area against the west glass wall of the vestibule were two (2) wood framed, with blue cushion, chairs and a wood, with blue cushion, love seat. Adjacent to the west side of the broken window on the north wall of the lobby was a wooden magazine rack and a wood framed, with blue cushion, chair. The magazine rack and one of the wooden framed chairs on the east side of the wood table had holes consistent with bullet holes within them. There was a stack of magazines in the magazine rack that had a hole consistent with a bullet hole going through the stack of magazines. The stack of magazines was seized collectively as Exhibit #132. The magazine rack and the chairs appeared to be out of place and a potted plant was tipped over consistent with a person or persons entering the lobby through the large hole in the glass on the north wall adjacent to the west side of the entrance door.

There were eleven (11) damaged areas consistent with bullet strikes in the lobby area. These bullet strikes were located within the cinder block and tile covered walls of the south wall of the lobby and west wall of the west hallway, as well as a display case on the south wall of the lobby, a magazine rack, coffee table and a chair located in the northern portion of the lobby. On the south wall of the lobby, west of the main office door, was a large built in display case with sliding glass doors and decorative arrangements. Beneath this display case was a free standing glass display case table with assorted decorative arrangements. This free standing display case had a hole in the glass that was consistent with a bullet hole located in the front (north) portion of the west side. This free standing display case was seized as Exhibit #133. Picture frames hanging on the west wall of the west hallway in the area of the lobby were damaged with holes consistent with bullet holes. The cinderblock walls behind the picture frames had damage consistent with divots made by a projectile passing through the picture frames and hitting the wall. No projectiles were observed in these divots. Two of these damaged picture frames were seized as Exhibit #130 and Exhibit #131. Exhibit #130 was a glass encased framed picture of "Red Slider" with a bullet hole and Exhibit #131 was a glass encased framed picture of "A Bear Named Trouble" with a bullet hole. There were two (2) copper-like projectiles seized from the west hallway, with one being adjacent to the gym (center of west hallway) seized as Exhibit #15 and the other being at the south end of the west hallway, seized as Exhibit #16. (The locations of the bullet strikes in the lobby labeled BH#1 thru BH #11 were measured into a sketch map for documentation by the CSP-CARS UNIT. REFER TO THE SKETCH MAP AND ASSOCIATED REPORTS COMPLETED BY THE CARS UNIT).

NORTH HALLWAY

The north hallway, as previously mentioned, contained the lobby, main office, nurse's room, rooms 1-10, and 12. The north hallway floor was made up of square two foot by two foot black, brown and white porcelain-like tile. The ceiling was approximately 8 feet high and the width of the hallway was approximately 8 feet 5 inches. The walls were comprised of white painted cinder block over tan colored tile with a blue painted divide between them. The lower portion of the wall was approximately 4 feet 7 inches of tan colored tile and the upper portion was approximately 3 feet 4 inches of white painted cinder block.

The even numbered rooms were on the north side of the hallway with classroom #12 being the western-most classroom and classroom #2 being the eastern-most. The odd numbered rooms were on the south side of the hallway with the main office being the western-most room and classroom #1 being the eastern-most. East of the main

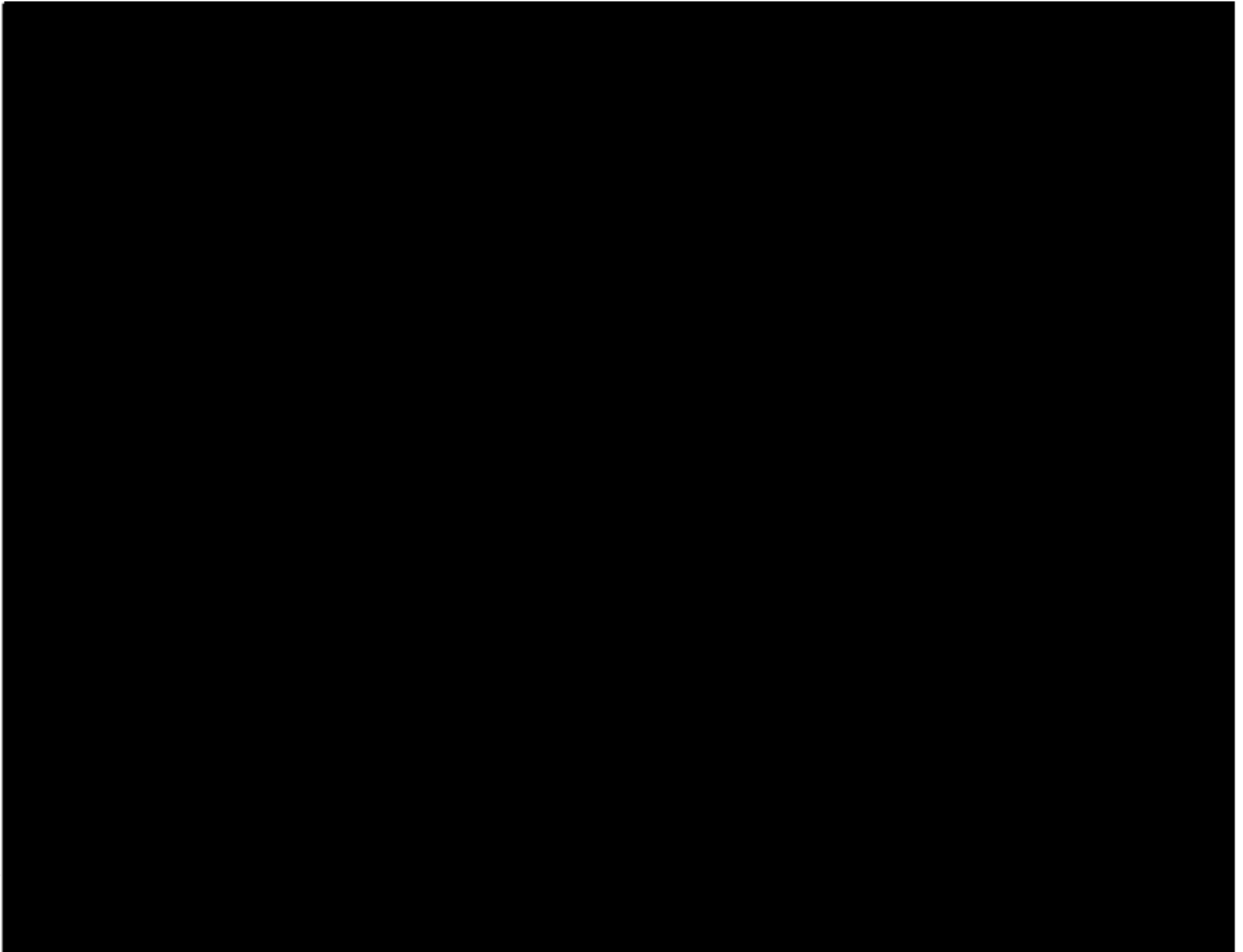

In the western-most area of the north hallway, before entry into the lobby area, were two deceased adult females, later identified as Principal Dawn Hochsprung

There was a writing easel lying on its side to the west of the victims. Newtown Police Detective Jason Frank reported to me that he put this easel in this location to prevent exiting children from seeing the victims.

There was a hole consistent with a bullet hole (BH-12) in the bore side of the door to Room #9 (Conference Room). This door opened outward into the hallway with the hinge side on the west side. The damage to the door was consistent with this door having been open to some degree at the time the projectile passed through it. This door was wooden with a large circular window on the upper portion of the door. There was yellow caution tape applied to the hallway floor in the area of the conference door. On the floor of the hallway, within this rectangular area marked with caution tape adjacent to Room #9 (Conference Room) was a lead-like projectile that was seized as Exhibit #7. There was a hole consistent with a bullet hole (BH-13) in the south wall of the hallway adjacent to the east side of the east door jamb of Room #9 (Conference Room). **(The locations of these bullet strikes labeled BH#12 thru BH #13 were measured into a sketch map for documentation by the CSP-CARS UNIT. REFER TO THE SKETCH MAP AND ASSOCIATED REPORTS COMPLETED BY THE CARS UNIT).**

There were Police and EMS belongings on the north hallway floor adjacent to the west side of Room #5 to include two "Life Pacs." On the floor in the north hallway was a tan bin containing children's books located on the floor adjacent to the west side of classroom #10 and on the east side of classroom #7. [REDACTED]

One (1) brass colored expended bullet casing bearing the head stamp "10mm Auto" was located and seized as Exhibit #8 from the south side of the north hallway floor just east of the conference room (Room #9).

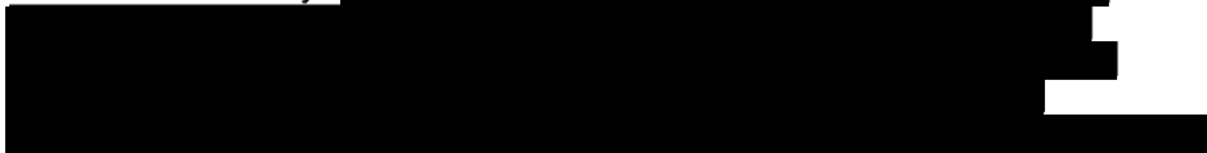

On the floor on the north side of the north hallway west of classroom #6 and east of classroom #8 were four (4) live rounds of 5.56 mm ammunition with the head stamp "S&B 60 5.56x45" (Seized as Exhibits #9-12). Adjacent to these live rounds was a "PMAG 30" black plastic magazine that contained eleven (11) live rounds of 5.56 ammunition. This magazine and the eleven (11) live rounds were seized as Exhibit #13.

At the southeast side of the north hallway was classroom #1 [REDACTED]. The door was located on the south wall of the north hallway and was located east of the east hallway. The door was not recessed into the hallway but instead opened directly into the hallway and was hinged on the east side. There was a hole, consistent with a bullet hole in the interior side of the lower portion the door to classroom #1. This projectile perforated the door leaving a hole on the exterior side of the door (BH#17) and a hole (BH#16) in the east wall of the north hallway to the south of classroom #1C (Custodial Closet). These series of holes are consistent with the door having been fully opened at the time the projectile inflicted the damage to the door.

There was a second hole in the east wall of the north hallway, in close proximity to the previously mentioned hole, also consistent with a bullet hole (BH-#15). This hole did not line up with any of the previously mentioned other holes in the door to classroom #1 and therefore would have occurred when the door was not fully open. There was a hole in the door for Room #1C (Custodial Closet) on the east wall of the north hallway in close proximity to the previously mentioned hole #15. This hole was also consistent with a bullet hole (BH-14). A copper jacketed projectile was seized as Exhibit #14 from the hallway area in close proximity to the threshold of classroom #1 entrance door from this hallway.

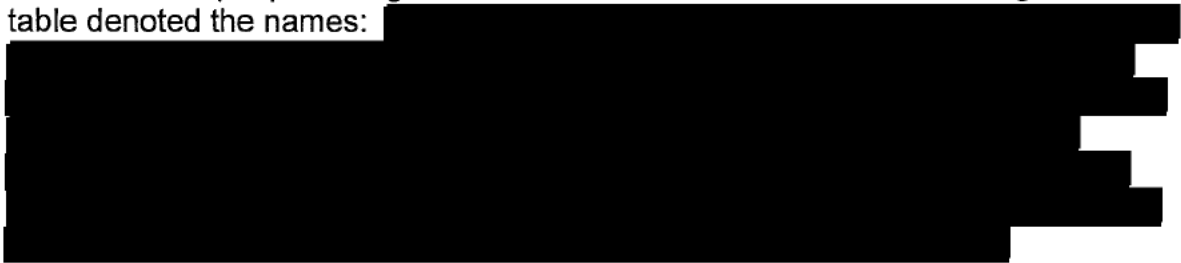

CONFERENCE ROOM (ROOM #9)

The conference room (Room #9) was located on the south side of the north hallway. The conference room door was located on the opposite side of the hallway and approximately 16 feet east of the entrance door for classroom #12. The conference room was approximately 39 feet east of the lobby. The conference room door, as previously mentioned, was wooden with a large circular window in the upper half of the door.

This window was not covered and the door was not locked. The conference room had a carpeted floor with an oval shaped conference table in the middle of the room. There were laptop computers and iPads on the table, as well as seven (7) paper name tags affixed to metal tag holders on the table. These name tags presumably denote the location of people sitting around this conference table. The name tags around the table denoted the names:



This room appeared orderly with the exception that there were chairs tipped over on their sides. Two chairs were tipped over in the area of Dawn Hochsprung's name tag located on the south side of the conference table. There were two chairs tipped over in the southeast corner of the room adjacent to a rectangular table with a desk phone on top of it. The desk phone was a hard-lined phone and was on its receiver. There was a tipped over chair in the southwest corner of the room adjacent to a rectangular table. There was a cream colored hard-lined wall phone mounted in the center of the west wall. This phone was on its receiver. There was a chair tipped over on the west side of the entrance door. There was a chair on the east side of the entrance door that was upright and had blood-like stains on it. Sgt. Cario later reported to me that he placed  in this chair to render her first aid.

The Emergency Evacuation Map was located inside Room #9 on the eastern door trim and was seized as Exhibit #82.

CLASSROOM #12 (Miss. Riog)

Classroom #12 was located on the north side of the north hallway and was the first classroom east of the front lobby. This classroom door was located approximately 23 feet east of the lobby and is accessed from a door that was recessed within the north side of the north hallway. As previously mentioned, the door opened outward (toward the hallway) and was wooden with a large circular window in the upper portion. This door was hinged on the east side. The window was covered on the outside (hallway side) with dark colored paper. The door could only be locked by using a key on the exterior door handle key lock. The interior door handle had no locking mechanism. This room was measured to be approximately 27 feet east to west and 30 feet north to south with carpeted floors and painted cinderblock walls. Fluorescent ceiling lights automatically turned on when entering the room.

There were eight large glass windows across the north wall which provided a view into the front (north) parking lot of the school and a partial view of the front patio area. There were four panes of glass to each large window. The top and second from the bottom panes opened up in a push-style manner. None of these windows appeared to be open. These windows had four (4) venetian blinds that covered two (2) windows each. The western-most blind was fully open and the blind was fully retracted toward the ceiling. The blind adjacent to the western-most blind was extended approximately 3/4 length of the window and partially closed. The other two blinds were extended approximately 3/4 the length of the window and in the open position. There were large posters across the lower portion of the windows limiting the view into the parking lot, with the exception of the two western-most windows. There was a book case along the entire north wall under the windows that stood approximately 2 feet 5 inches high and 1 foot 6 inches deep. There were posters across the lower portion of the windows partially but not completely limiting the view into the parking lot. There were stacks of items and supplies on the top of the bookcase under the windows that partially blocked the view from these eight (8) windows.

The teacher's desk was located in the northwest corner of the room. On the south side of the teacher's desk was a white bag with an orange wallet that contained the Connecticut driver's license for [REDACTED]. There was also a set of keys on the desk to include a vehicle key for a "BMW". The west wall of the classroom was a shared wall with the front lobby of the school. The northwest corner of this classroom was closest to the area of the front entrance to the school.

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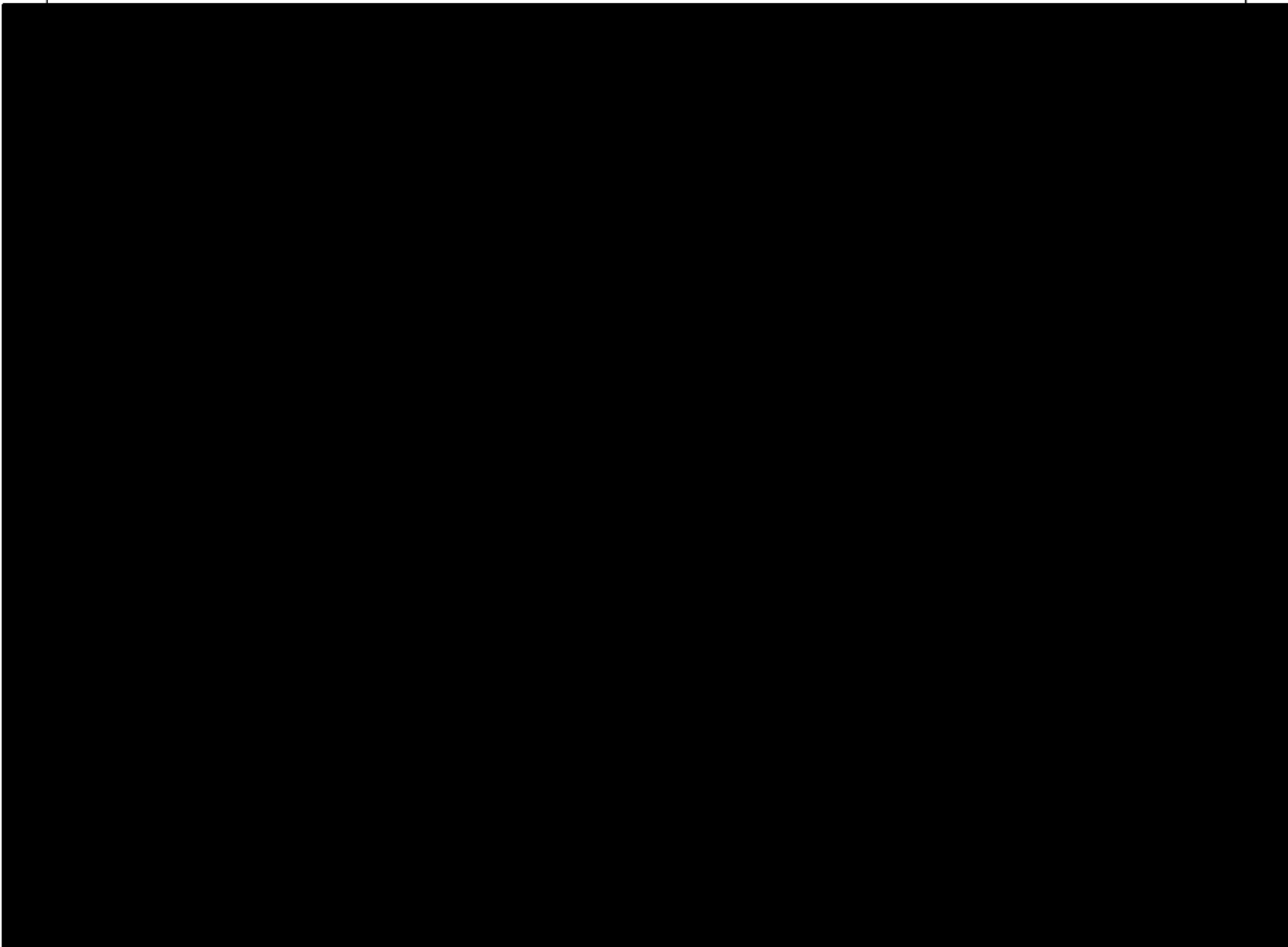

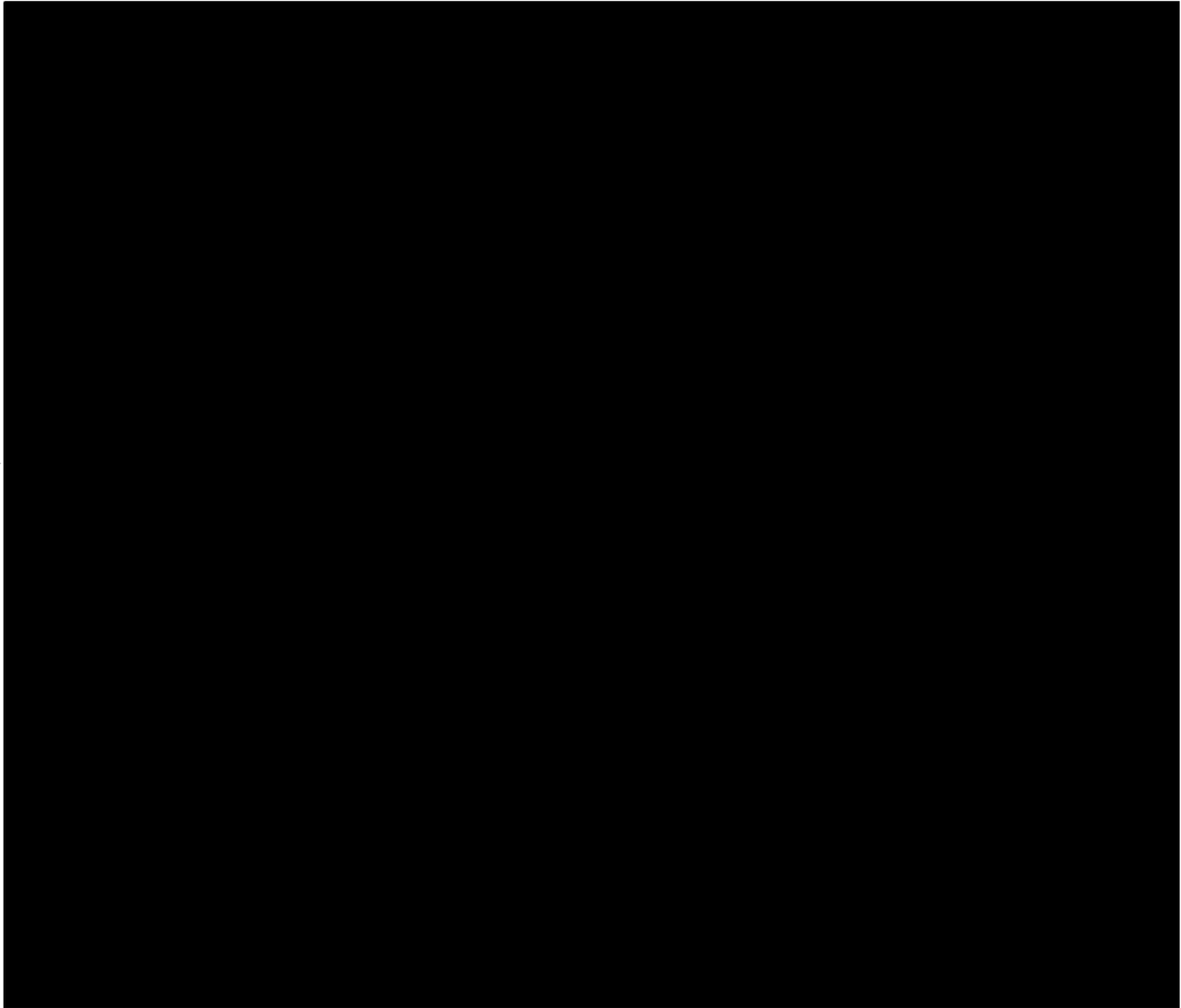

Located on the floor east of the shooter was a "Glock" 10 mm semi-automatic pistol that was seized as Exhibit #19 (one "Glock" 10 mm, S/N SMA461). One round was partially loaded in the chamber, with a magazine of eight (8) rounds remaining). I observed this pistol to be lying on its left side pointed in a southwest direction. This pistol was measured to be approximately 2 feet 6 inches north of the hallway entrance door and approximately 2 feet 8 inches east of the suspect. This pistol appeared to be jammed with a partially open ejection port and one (1) live round of "10mm Auto" ammunition partially loaded into the chamber. This pistol contained one (1) "Glock 10mm" magazine that contained eight (8) live rounds of 10mm ammunition with the head stamp "10 mm Auto". (Magazines full capacity is 15). This pistol had numerous attached hairs to the front sight area of the pistol. These hairs were consistent in color with that of the shooter's hair. I observed one expended 10 mm casing located on the west side of the hallway entrance door in the area of the shooter. This expended casing was seized as part of Exhibit #37 (from the southwest quadrant of classroom #10). There were four (4) live rounds of 10 mm ammunition all with the head stamp "10mm AUTO" on the floor in the southeastern portion of the classroom which is also the area the shooter was located. These live rounds of 10mm ammunition were seized as Exhibits #22 thru #25. [NOTE: Four live 10 mm rounds found under the body, nine live 10 mm rounds in the pistol, and two expended 10 mm casings located = 15 rounds total, making a full capacity magazine]

A black colored "Flexfit" canvas "boonie-styled" hat was located on the floor northeast of the suspect. This hat was seized as Exhibit #21. This hat had blood-like stains, hairs and a hole consistent with a bullet hole in the forward portion of the top of the hat. This hole was consistent with having been worn by the shooter at the time the shooter received a bullet to the right rear lower portion of his head which exited out the top forward portion of his head and hat. There was a pair of small wire framed glasses on the floor north of Exhibit #19 (Glock 10 mm). These glasses had blood-like stains on them and appeared to be small and consistent with child size glasses. There was no deceased child in close proximity to the shooter's body.

TRAJECTORY OF SUSPECTED SUICIDE SHOT

There was a hole consistent with a bullet hole located in the ceiling tile located approximately 8 feet 1 inch from the south wall and 5 feet 2 inches from the east wall. This hole was documented in photographs as "SBH #1 room 10". This projectile struck but did not penetrate a corrugated metal ceiling that was

elevated and behind the ceiling tile. This strike was documented in photographs as "Strike #1 A". The projectile ricocheted and was later located above the ceiling tile in classroom 8 and seized as Exhibit # 98 (a lead and copper projectile). In the ceiling there was only a knee wall separating the two rooms. Trajectory documentation was completed on this hole with a documented horizontal angle (right (east) to left (west) of 66 degrees) and a vertical angle of 40 degrees from the floor. At a height of 5 feet along the path of this trajectory the muzzle would be located at approximately 7 feet 7 inches from the east wall and 7 feet 9 inches from the south wall.

Trajectory documentation, locations of blood-like stains, tissue, hair, and the shooter's body are all consistent with the shooter standing and facing in an east direction at the time of receiving a suspected self-inflicted gunshot wound to the right side of his head.

"BUSHMASTER" semi-automatic rifle [Exhibit #17]

A Bushmaster caliber .223 rifle, model XM15-E2S with associated serial number L534858 was located on the floor of classroom #10 and was seized as Exhibit #17. This rifle was located west of the southern-most cluster of desks and east of the door on the west wall that provides access to classroom #12. This rifle was lying on its right side pointed in a northeast direction. This rifle had a shoulder strap that was attached in the front to the underside of the forearm in the area under the rear attachment for the front site. The rear portion of the sling attachment had become detached when a threaded nut failed and detached from the underside of the rear portion of the stock. The black threaded nut that was consistent with the sling attachment to the rifle was located on the floor in close proximity (approximately 2 feet northeast) of the rifle (Exhibit #17). This black thread nut was seized as Exhibit #33. It could not be determined whether the sling failed during use or when it was placed, thrown or dropped on the floor.

The rifle (Exhibit #17) was observed to be lying on the floor on its right side. The rifle safety indicator was on "FIRE". There was one (1) live round of 5.56 mm ammunition in the chamber and one (1) "PMAG 30" magazine in the magazine well, containing fourteen (14) live 5.56 mm rounds of ammunition. The charging handle was observed to be in the forward position with no obvious malfunctioning issues. The barrel of the rifle had a muzzle break.

PURPOSE STATEMENT



In order to ensure that the school environment is safe for all students, the Newtown Public Schools have the capacity to deal with a crisis and emergencies when they occur. It is important that every staff person have an understanding of district and school plans regarding emergencies, and understands their responsibilities. Building personnel who know the students, parents and school community are best able to provide direction and support in times of a crisis. School-based teams can react quickly, respond in a personal and individualized manner, and continue monitoring the after effects of a crisis. This guide is intended to provide both essential information and instructions to enable a school to respond appropriately in case of an emergency and to provide information on prevention, intervention, and post-crisis planning.

UNKNOWN PERSON/INTRUDERS

Staff, faculty and students should be observant at all times. Be diligent in reporting any and all unknown persons entering the school property, either in the parking lots or inside the facility.

1. Keep a cautious distance from the person while you introduce yourself and offer the person help to establish a valid or a suspicious response.
2. Go to the nearest phone [REDACTED] who will notify [REDACTED] of the sighting, if the person is suspicious.

BUILDING DISRUPTIONS

RESPONDING TO A DISRUPTION ACCORDING TO THE LEVEL OF SERIOUSNESS AND INTENSITY.

LEVEL 1. When a disruption is confined to one area and there is no threat to students or staff, (e.g., intruder or verbally abusive individual):

1. Go to [REDACTED] who will then notify [REDACTED]
2. Indicate [REDACTED] as the kind of response needed and identify the exact location.
3. Containment and removal with minimum interruption of the educational processes should be the overall practice.

LEVEL 2. When disruptive forces pose a direct threat to members of the school community (e.g., threatening, suspicious or angry intruders, gang activity or possibility of weapon possession):

1. Go to [REDACTED] who will notify [REDACTED] of the sighting.
2. Indicate [REDACTED] as the kind of response needed and identify the exact location.
3. Institute classroom "lockdown" [REDACTED]

SUGGESTED EVACUATION SITES AND TRANSPORTATION

OUTDOOR EVACUATION - TEMPORARY HOLDING AREA AND EARLY DISMISSAL

1. Outdoor evacuation - temporary holding area and early dismissal. Primary holding areas are [REDACTED].
2. Secondary holding area will be [REDACTED]. A member of the Incident Management Team will secure that road to ensure safety of students from traffic. Classroom teachers and rest of Incident Management Team (IMT) will escort classes to designated area. Should it become necessary to transport students to Relocation Site (see below), students will be escorted to [REDACTED].

INDOOR - SHELTER IN PLACE

1. In certain emergency situations [REDACTED] may serve as areas of refuge. These areas are large enough to accommodate all of the students and staff. They also have double exits, close proximity to bathroom facilities and a means of communication.

WEATHER RELATED EMERGENCIES

EARTHQUAKE

Because earthquakes can strike without warning, the immediate need is to protect lives by taking the best available cover. All other actions must wait until the tremors subside.

1. **Shelter In Place/Duck and Cover.** Advise staff and students (code for shelter in place) to take shelter under desks, tables or furniture. Hold onto the legs of the furniture and keep away from windows, electrical equipment and cabinets. Drop to your knees, make body as small as possible, and bury face in your arms. If outdoors, stay clear of buildings, trees and power lines. Stay outdoors. Lie face down and wait for tremors to subside.
2. Determine a temporary command post and notify the Incident Management Team. Assess the situation.
3. Identify injured persons. If necessary call 911 for emergency services.
4. Identify danger zones and set up inner and outer perimeters to control access and limit risk.
5. Consider **selective evacuation** while continuing to **shelter in place**. Inspect buildings before moving.
6. Shut off ventilation system.
7. Identify and request needed resources.

TORNADO / HURRICANE / SEVERE THUNDERSTORM

Tornadoes, hurricanes and severe thunderstorms may occur in this area. Information regarding tornadoes will be broadcast on the National Weather Station and usually provides 12-24 hours of advanced warning. This does not generally constitute an in-school emergency. The Superintendent will relay information to all the principals. However, should a situation arise where you are caught in session without notice, do the following:

1. Continue normal operations and notify the Incident Management Team.
2. Open a command post and remain available to give orders and receive information.
3. Make and maintain communications with the Superintendent of Schools.
4. Try to determine the level of threat and amount of time left to react.
5. Choose either **early dismissal** if sufficient time remains, or, if not, **Shelter in Place**.
6. Make radio announcements and notify parents in a timely fashion.
7. If necessary, advise the population of **High Wind Emergency** practices. Take shelter in hallways at pre-designated locations using Duck and Cover protocol. Keep away from windows, electrical equipment and cabinets. Drop to your knees, make body as small as possible, and bury face in arms.



FACILITY EMERGENCIES

POWER FAILURE

Sandy Hook School is equipped with an emergency power system. The school is self-supporting and allows normal operation. However, if this system should fail:

1. Children will be kept in their rooms monitored by appropriate staff until it is determined whether or not an early dismissal is warranted.
2. The principal and all members of the Incident Management Team will immediately report to the Main Office. The room fits the criteria for a command post and is naturally lit with a southern exposure.
3. Shelter in place. The Incident Management Team should verbally inform staff and students to remain where they are until further notice.
4. Notify and consult with Building Grounds Director [REDACTED] cell phone [REDACTED], pager [REDACTED]
5. Notify and consult with the Superintendent's office [REDACTED]
6. Consider moving students in darkness, if necessary, to a naturally lit area in the building.
7. Determine whether early dismissal or a move to an alternate site is warranted.
8. Notify Director of Transportation [REDACTED]

FIRE / GAS LEAK

1. **Activate the fire alarm and evacuate facility. Do not use the elevators.**
No bells, switches, or electronic devices, etc. may be used.
Portable radios and cell phone communication are safe.
2. Teachers, via directions posted in every classroom, "follow" students out of classroom to assure no one is left behind. Staff and students must be at least 75-100 feet away from the structure and clear of road ways.
3. Incident Management Team is to report to their designated posts with portable radios while custodians shall check buildings for person then exit.
4. Notify Building Grounds Director [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] Cell phone [REDACTED] pager [REDACTED].
He will notify the Gas Company and the Superintendent's office at [REDACTED].
5. Maintenance personnel should respond as rapidly as possible to investigate the problem area.
6. If the principal determines that the emergency will be of considerable duration, or if remaining at the school site presents a hazard, directions will be given for moving to an alternate site or dismissal.
7. All emergency early dismissals will be announced on the radio and parents will be contacted if at all possible.

BOMB THREATS

Keep the caller on the line as long as possible. Write the exact wording of the threat. Ask caller to repeat the message. Pay particular attention to background noises, such as motors running, music playing, and any other noise which may give a clue as to the location of the caller. Listen closely to the voice (male, female), voice quality (calm, excited), accents, and speech impediments.

Questions to ask the caller:

What is your name? _____
When is the bomb going to explode? _____
Where is the bomb right now? _____

Did you place the bomb? _____
Why do you want to hurt innocent people? _____

Immediately after the caller hangs up, report the information to the principal of the school.

ACTION GUIDE

1. **Establish communication and assess situation.** Principal attempts to determine, from available information (type of call, age of caller, nature of message, etc.), whether the threat is merely a hoax or a bonafide threat. In either case be prepared and immediately notify:

- Incident Management Team [REDACTED]
- Local Police/Emergency Services (911).
- Superintendent of Schools [REDACTED]
- State Police Bomb Squad. [REDACTED]

As soon as possible, choose one of following options:

- A. Continue program and investigate the threat.
- B. Evacuate immediately and search after evacuation. [REDACTED] means evacuate facility in the normal timely fashion and wait for outside resources to arrive.
- C. Search and evacuate, if warranted. [REDACTED] means shelter in place and stay put.

2. **Identify the Danger Zone (with option C.)** The principal should utilize the staff to assist in the search, each staff member having a pre-designated area. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] An evacuation can be accomplished expeditiously while at the same time avoiding the potential danger areas. If a suspicious item is found, leave it alone and move to the next step. Open all doors and windows if possible.

Evacuation options:

- A. Standard fire drill method of evacuation.
- B. Extended distance evacuation to [REDACTED]
- C. Inclement weather evacuation to [REDACTED]

3. **Set Inner Perimeter.** [REDACTED]
 4. **Set Outer Perimeter.** [REDACTED]
 5. **Open a Command Post.** You should open a command post (to be determined) as soon as possible. It should be [REDACTED]
 6. **Activate Staging Areas.** Point out where resources could or should report before they are deployed.
 7. **Identify and Request Needed Resources.** As early as possible, try to assess what resources might be needed and request that they be made available. Be proactive and creative when ordering resources. Know what the district can provide, but also know what might be available through other nearby sources. Sound judgement dictates locating equipment and supplies already in the area that can be invaluable. Regardless of where the resources come from, direct them to the staging areas so they can be called upon when needed.
- As soon as possible, choose one of the following:
- A. Return to normal operation. Decision made concurrently by a building principal/police.
 - B. Early dismissal. Decision to be made by the superintendent.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE REPORT

If a confirmed case of communicable disease has been reported that could affect the student population or staff, the Coordinator of Health Services, in collaboration with the School Medical Advisor, the Director of Health, and the Superintendent of Schools will take the necessary precautions to contain and/or alleviate any potential health risk.

- Any staff member who has knowledge of a potential health risk due to a contagion to the student population or staff should report this to the school nurse immediately.
- The school nurse will take the necessary steps to confirm or deny the possible contagion by contacting the parents and advising them of the need to seek medical consultation.
- The nurse, after consulting with the school medical advisor, will exclude the student from school.
- The student will continue to be excluded until such time as the medical care provider has confirmed, in writing, that it is safe for the student to return to school.
- If there has been a potential exposure to other persons in the school, the Coordinator of Health Services, School Medical Advisor and Director of Health will collaborate on what expedient and effective procedures should be implemented.
- The private physician should notify state and local health departments of all reportable cases after consulting with the school medical advisor.
- Any release of information to the media will be made through the Office of the Superintendent.
- Confidentiality will be maintained.

YOUTH SUICIDE PREVENTION

The Newtown Public Schools believe that any school employee who may have knowledge of a student who could potentially commit suicide must take the proper steps, as specified in the Board Policy and Regulations, which include notifying the student's parents or guardians/surrogates and taking the appropriate steps to ensure the student's safety.

SOME WARNING SIGNS OR RISK FACTORS

- expression of suicidal thoughts
- preoccupation with death
- abrupt changes in personality such as crying, irritability, recklessness, promiscuity, atypical sleeping or eating patterns, apathy, declining grades
- withdrawal from friends
- giving away possessions
- excessive grieving from a recent loss (e.g., death in the family or the breaking up of a relationship), previous history of suicide or suicidal gestures, feeling of worthlessness
- abuse of alcohol, or other drugs
- access to weapons, especially guns

These factors become even more significant if a parent, friend, or sibling has committed suicide.

GUIDELINES FOR REACTING TO POTENTIAL SUICIDE

If a student confides in you that he/she is contemplating suicide do not keep it a secret. Try to transfer the child's trust in you to a school specialist, (i.e., psychologist, social worker or crisis counselor) who will work with the student and involve a responsible parent or guardian in arranging for treatment outside school.

If school is not in session and there is no responsible parent or guardian/surrogate, the suicidal person needs to get to Danbury Hospital's Crisis Intervention Center via the emergency room, which is open 24 hours every day (phone 797-7899).

ISSUES OF DEATH AND DYING AND STAFF RESPONSIBILITIES

PRINCIPAL SHOULD

1. Verify the death or situational information with family.
2. Notify other appropriate personnel who may need to check on siblings.
Call Superintendent with known information so he can be prepared for the media.
3. Call faculty meeting and alert all staff.
4. Call crisis team/caring committee coordinator to identify and assist vulnerable staff and students. Plan to offer students and staff time out, counseling, or just someone with whom to talk.
5. Work with team/committee to chair faculty/staff meeting to announce incident.
6. Draft memo for students to be read by teachers.
7. Draft a letter to parents.
8. Assist with contacting helping agencies and individuals.
9. Assist with identifying vulnerable staff and students.
10. Hold a brief end-of-day faculty meeting.
11. Arrange to return student or staff belongings in a personalized and caring manner.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Attempt to de-mystify the incident.
- Be honest.
- Respond to any questions asked about the incident.
- Avoid supplying graphic details.
- Remember that children often lack the sophistication to discuss death and tragedy in a sensitive way.
- Model honest expression of feelings on your own part.
- Be attentive to the non-verbal communication.
- A decrease in activity levels may indicate a strong sense of sadness or a sense of being overwhelmed.
- An increase in energy or excitability may indicate the youth's subconscious attempts to distract themselves from the reality of the events (denial).

CONCEPTS OF THE DYING PROCESS

There are four major aspects of death that children struggle to comprehend as they grow:

- Death is irreversible (permanent and final).
- Death is universal - all life will ultimately succumb to death.
- Death ends physical sensations and functioning.
- Death has specific causes, such as injury or illness.

Grieving is age-dependent. The stage of psychological development that a child has reached will affect his/her grieving.

- Children under three years old do not distinguish between death and absence.
- Children 3-5 years old begin to understand death as something that happens to others.
This group often personifies death as a person or thing. This age group still believes that death can be avoided or escaped.

5. Open a Command Post

A command post should be opened as soon as possible. It should be [REDACTED]. A number of factors should be considered when selecting a site for the command post: good communications capabilities, good lighting and ventilation with adequate resources, access to response personnel on site as well as district-level managers in the district office. At the same time, they must have access to the command post. The command post should have adequate security. It should not be subjected to unwarranted interruptions by people not involved in the response such as media, parents and onlookers. It is not important to have a view of the danger zone.

It is a good idea that [REDACTED] the secondary command post will likely be a viable alternative. Always be prepared to consider a third site [REDACTED]. Large facilities such as the high school and middle school might actually have three predetermined command posts. Just because there are predetermined sites does not mean administrators are locked into using them.

6. Activate Staging Areas

Staging areas are where all emergency resources should be sent before they are deployed. Without

these areas, resources tend to bunch up and clog the scene making an effective response almost impossible. There can be more than one staging area for each event. The number of areas activated will be determined by the type of incident, the number of resources being sent, and the geographic and logistical aspects of getting those resources to the site. When considering where to locate a staging area, several factors should be considered:

- **Size of Area** – A staging area must be large enough to accommodate many vehicles and personnel on a standby basis, such as fire trucks, heavy equipment, police, and the Life Star Helicopter.
- **Good Access** – Resources must be able to get to the staging area. Make it as easy as possible to stage resources so they can be called up as soon as they are needed. The location should allow for a quick and effective deployment. As a rule, a resource should be capable of operation within three to five minutes after being called up.
- **Security** – The staging area should be located in a spot that has little chance of becoming threatened by the event. If the area is too close to the source, it could become part of the danger zone. In a hazardous materials incident, the staging area should not be located down wind of the source.
- **A Staging Area** is often a good site for a media information center. Television reporters will want to use dramatic visuals to report a major event. Since many resources will be in the staging area, live reports can be fed using lighting from emergency vehicles.

7. Identify and Request Needed Resources

As early as possible, try to assess what resources might be needed and request that they be made available. Be proactive and creative when ordering resources. Know what the district can provide, but also know what might be available through other nearby sources.

- Children 5-9 begin to understand death as a personal event. Death is usually associated with injury and mutilation. Children 10 years and older generally understand death as an ultimate outcome in life.
- Adolescents often become "fixated" with death as they begin to realize that their goals will take time to achieve and death could potentially interfere with these.

The child may not be able to express feelings in words. DO NOT RESUSCITATE ORDERS

In the event a "Do-Not-Resuscitate" order is received from a licensed physician for a student in the Newtown Public Schools, the school nursing staff may honor the order providing the following criteria are met.

1. A written order from the physician is on file in the student's health record.
2. A D.N.R. bracelet is in place on the student.
3. A copy of the "informed consent" form signed by the parent/guardian is on file in the student's health record.
4. A written emergency care plan is in place for the student.
5. A registered nurse is at the school where the student with the D.N.R bracelet is in attendance.

THE AH HAZARDS APPROACH

The responsibility for resolving most critical incidents will reside with local public safety agencies. *Until those agencies arrive on scene*, however, the primary responders will be [REDACTED]. While district personnel may not be able to solve the problem, they can take steps to keep an incident from becoming worse. These steps are known as the *Seven Critical Tasks*.

The Seven Critical Tasks are based on the premise that since there is a similar set of characteristics at the onset of most major events, it follows that there is a similar set of responses for getting those incidents under control. The tasks are designed to be performed in the first 30 minutes or so of an incident, the time of the most confusion and danger. Each task may not be applicable for all events, but using the set as a checklist will ensure that our initial response will always be sound. The Seven Critical Tasks are as follows:

1. Establish Communications

The first step in handling any crisis is to establish communications. Set up a system that enables you to contact and stay in contact with the people with whom you need to talk. Use whatever means are at your disposal. Open phone lines, clear radio channels, identify runners to deliver messages, whatever it takes. Once communication is established, secure the lines so you always have access to them. Move normal traffic to other phones and channels. Reserve your lines for response activity only.

Besides establishing communications at the scene, a site-based Incident Coordinator (Principal) should contact the district **INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM** to discuss the level of support that might be needed. Depending on the incident, a decision will be made to activate a district-level response to coordinate activities at all affected sites. Communication with the district team should be maintained throughout the incident.

2. Identify the Danger Zone

As soon as possible, identify the exact location of the danger zone, the area posing a risk to lives and property. Sometimes it is not just confined to the physical location of the problem. In a hazardous materials incident such as a chemical spill, the danger zone would be the source of the leak plus the immediate area in the direction the chemical is traveling. On a windy day, the area exposed to vapors can be large.

Once the danger zone is established, take steps to limit the risk. No one should be allowed in or out of this area unless an evacuation is necessary. People caught in a danger zone are often better off sheltering in place for the short term. If they are safe where they are, it doesn't make sense to risk moving them.

MEDIA CRISIS COMMUNICATION PLAN

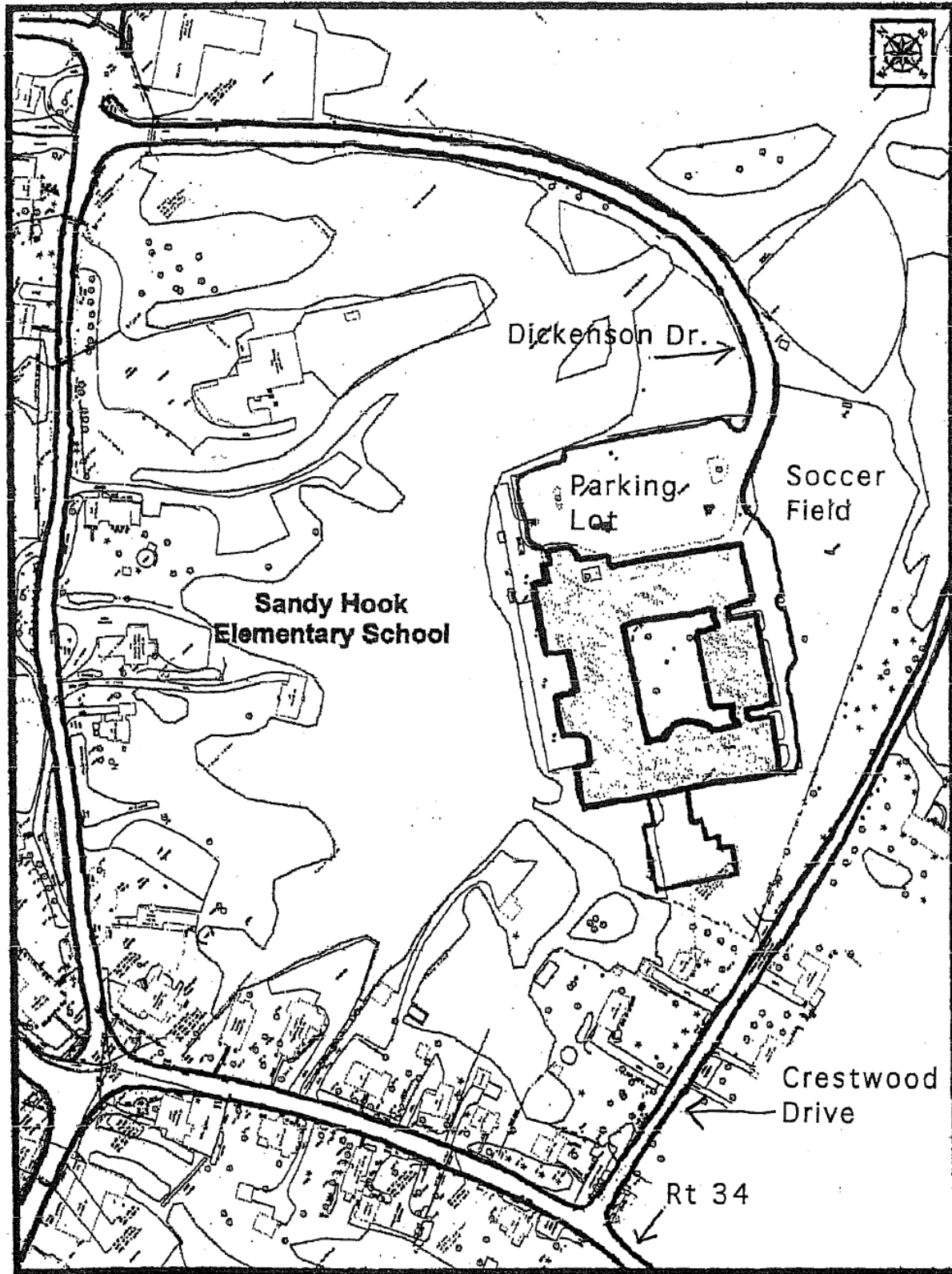
1. When a crisis occurs, the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent should be notified and immediately obtain all the facts in concert with the building principal.
2. The Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent or their designee, the principal and others (e.g. police, fire and health officials), as needed, shall determine the action plan related to communicating the crisis and who shall be the one and only spokesperson.
3. A communication center shall be established that is isolated from the incident. Telephone lines to that office should be designated as the only lines to be used for communication purposes.
4. All issues should be reviewed such as: (a) How will the community be informed and to what degree? (b) What is the chain of communication? (c) Are there any legal considerations?
5. Once a plan has been established, all parties involved in the crisis should be informed.
6. The spokesperson is the only one to speak to and/or answer questions from the media and from the public.
7. In a crisis situation, a designated area will be identified for the media to be assigned (staging areas) until school officials can brief them.

The following list of suggestions can help increase the educational aspect of the TV, newspaper, radio or magazine stories surrounding a crisis and minimize the potential emotional dangers that inadequate reporting may promote. Principals may be asked to speak to the media after the initial crisis has been managed.

1. Set policies and make decisions regarding working with the media **BEFORE** the occurrence of an emotional event.
2. Direct all media inquiries to the Superintendent of Schools. This avoids confusion in times of crisis and ensures consistency in the information given to the media.
3. Insist that no media representatives are to be allowed on school grounds during school hours. Provide representatives with a time and place when information will be disseminated.
4. Use clear, simple, layman terminology so the readers or viewers can understand.
5. Avoid being defensive. Do not treat the interviewer as an adversary. Acknowledge the difficulty of the media's role and take the position of helpfulness. If you do not know the answer to a question, find out and call back, or put the interviewer in contact with another resource. Place media coverage high on your list of priorities and view it as an asset to your work.
6. Use caution if the interviewer requests to be put in contact with witnesses, alleged offenders, or survivors. Your first priority is to protect your students and minimize the traumatic effects of the crisis situation.
7. Make clear before being recorded or interviewed that you do not think it will be appropriate to discuss specific details of the event (particularly suicide or weapons-related deaths). Avoid sensationalizing. General information is more beneficial.
8. Describe the roles and support of your crisis team, staff members, or community members who were helpful during the initial crisis response.
9. Do not insist on seeing questions ahead of the interview or editing the final copy. The media will only use what fits the purpose, theme or time frame of their medium.

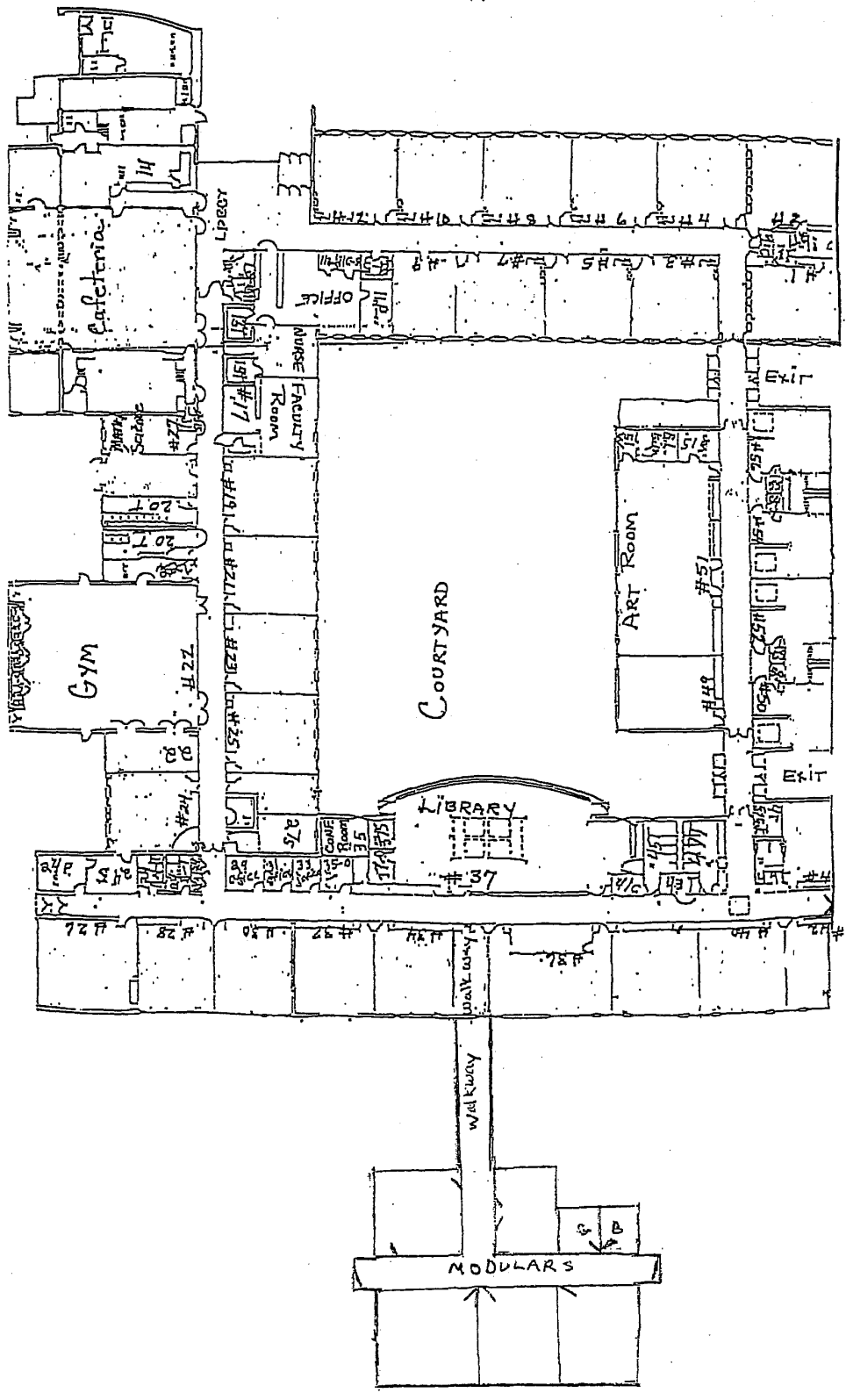

Comments from the Superintendent

UNKNOWN PERSON/INTRUDERS

Staff, faculty and students should be observant at all times. Be diligent in reporting any and all unknown persons entering the school property, either in the parking lots or inside the facility.

1. Keep a cautious distance from the person while you introduce yourself and offer the person help to establish a valid or a suspicious response.
2. Go to the nearest phone and call [REDACTED] who will notify [REDACTED] of the sighting, if the person is suspicious.

BUILDING DISRUPTIONS

RESPONDING TO A DISRUPTION ACCORDING TO THE LEVEL OF SERIOUSNESS AND INTENSITY.

LEVEL 1. When a disruption is confined to one area and there is no threat to students or staff, (e.g., intruder or verbally abusive individual):

1. Go to [REDACTED] who will then notify an [REDACTED].
2. Indicate "[REDACTED]" as the kind of response needed and identify the exact location.
3. Containment and removal with minimum interruption of the educational processes should be the overall practice.

LEVEL 2. When disruptive forces pose a direct threat to members of the school community (e.g., threatening, suspicious or angry intruders, gang activity or possibility of weapon possession):

1. Go to [REDACTED] who will notify [REDACTED] of the sighting.
2. Indicate "[REDACTED]" as the kind of response needed and identify the exact location.
3. Institute classroom "lockdown" with [REDACTED] on the intercom.
4. [REDACTED] to notify Incident Management Team and police if necessary. [REDACTED]

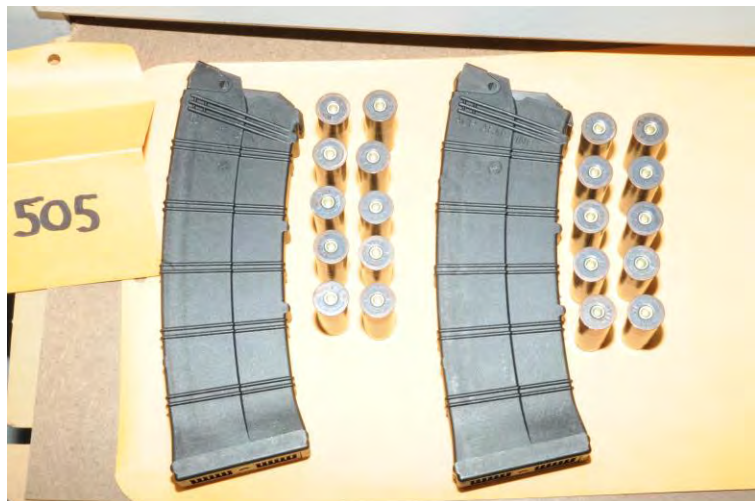

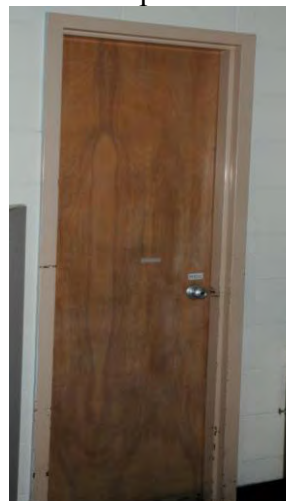

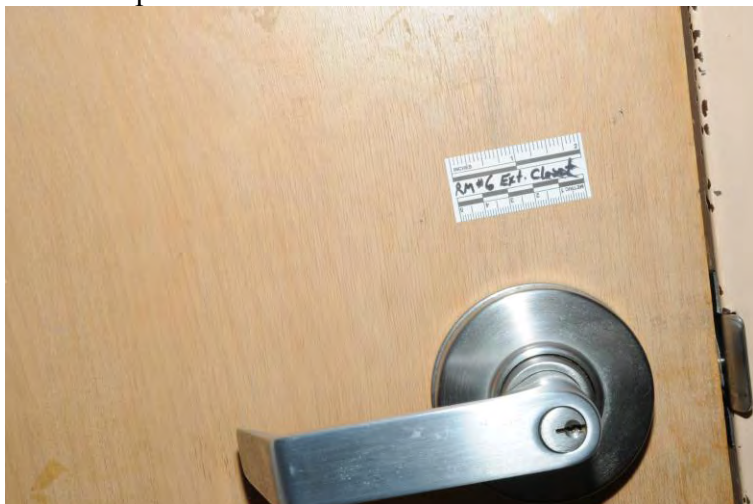

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

Action Taken:


On Friday, December 14, 2012 at approximately 0935 hours, the Newtown Police Department received a 911 call reporting an active shooter at the Sandy Hook Elementary School located at 12 Dickinson Drive Newtown, CT. Law enforcement officers responded immediately and discovered numerous school children and school personnel deceased from apparent gunshot wounds. A white male wearing military style clothing was located deceased on a classroom floor. The deceased white male was in possession of several handguns and a military style assault weapon. A 2010 black Honda Accord bearing CT registration plate 872YEO was parked unoccupied in the fire lane in front of the school. The registered owner of the vehicle is Nancy J. Lanza DOB [REDACTED]-1960 of 36 Yogananda Street Sandy Hook, CT. As a result law enforcement officers including the Connecticut State Police Emergency Services Unit (E.S.U.) responded to 36 Yogananda Street Sandy Hook, CT to investigate.

Members of The Connecticut State Police E.S.U. arrived at 36 Yogananda Street Sandy Hook, CT. Upon E.S.U. arrival all doors were found locked at the residence. Forced entry was made by members of the E.S.U. team. At that time an adult white female, tentatively identified as Nancy J. Lanza DOB [REDACTED]-1960 was located deceased in the second floor master bedroom (E.S.U. report to follow). It appeared she had sustained at least two gunshot wounds to the head while lying in the bed. The scene was then secured as a crime scene. Newtown Police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation maintained the scene security.

At approximately 1510 hours Eastern District Major Crime Squad (EDMCS) Detectives were assigned to investigate the murder at 36 Yogananda Street Sandy Hook, CT. A search warrant application was prepared and submitted for the residence by Detectives James McGlynn and Scott Wisner of the Connecticut State Police Central District Major Crime Squad (CDMCS). At approximately 1729 hours the search warrant was approved and issued by the Honorable Judge John F. Blawie.

On December 14, 2012 at approximately 1945 hours EDMCS began the search of the scene located at 36 Yogananda Street Sandy Hook, CT. The scene was documented by digital video, digital images and a sketch map (supplemental reports to follow). Detectives searched the residence and seized numerous items to include a Savage Arms .22 caliber rifle near the deceased, spent shell casings, Blood Like Substance, electronic items, papers, ammunition, an Enfield 303 Rifle and empty handgun and long gun cases. During that search members of the Federal Bureau of Investigation- Behavioral Analysis Unit entered the scene to obtain items for their investigation. Supervisory Special Agent Molly Amman and her team removed four boxes and one paper bag of items from various locations in the residence for their investigation. Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms agents Dawn Dodsworth and Daniel Futrell entered the scene and obtained information on the firearms located in the residence. At approximately 0335 hours the deceased female was removed from the residence by Connecticut Trade Service and transported to the Office of Chief Medical Examiner at 11 Shuttle Road Farmington, CT for post-mortem examination. At approximately 1530 hours on December 15, 2012 the search was suspended and Newtown Police and mutual aid officers maintained scene security.

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On Sunday December 16, 2012 at approximately 0915 hours Dr. H. Wayne Carver II, Chief Medical Examiner, conducted a post-mortem examination of the deceased at the O.C.M.E. in Farmington, CT. At that time the cause of death was certified as: Multiple Gunshot Wounds of Head. The manner of death was certified as: Homicide. The examination revealed among other things that the deceased had sustained [REDACTED]. Evidence was seized at autopsy and post-mortem inked fingerprints were taken. The deceased's fingerprints were positively identified by the State Police Bureau of Identification as those of Nancy J. Lanza DOB [REDACTED]-1960.

On Sunday December 16, 2012 at approximately 1130 hours Eastern District Major Crime Squad Detectives resumed the search of 36 Yogananda Street Sandy Hook, CT. At that time additional items were seized as evidence (see evidence report). The search was suspended at approximately 0030 hours on December 17, 2012. Newtown Police and mutual aid officers maintained scene security.



On Monday December 17, 2012 at approximately 1445 hours Eastern District Major Crime Squad Detectives resumed the search of 36 Yogananda Street Sandy Hook, CT. At that time additional items were seized as evidence (see evidence report). At approximately 1655 hours on December 17, 2012 the search was suspended. Newtown Police and mutual aid officers maintained scene security.


While assisting with the search and processing of the crime scene located at 36 Yogananda Street Sandy Hook, CT this writer made the following observations:

EXTERIOR

The residence is located at 36 Yogananda Street Sandy Hook, CT. Sandy Hook is located within the town of Newtown, CT. Yogananda Street is a paved two lane roadway in a residential neighborhood. The roadway runs in a north to south direction in the area of the residence. There is a paved driveway on the east side of Yogananda Street that leads to the residence on top of a hill overlooking Yogananda Street. The Lanza residence is a two story, colonial style single family home with an attached two car garage. The residence has a pale yellow wooden siding and green shutters. A grey mailbox with "36 Yogananda Street" printed on it is located north of the driveway apron on the east side of Yogananda Street. The mailbox contains a delivery slip from [REDACTED] for 131.9 gallons of heating oil dated 12-14-2012. There is no time of delivery listed on slip. Further investigation revealed that the delivery was made between 0930 and 1000 hours (see [REDACTED] witness report) The perimeter of the residence was secured by members of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Newtown Police Department upon this writer's arrival.

The doors of the two car garage are located on the north end of the residence. The east garage door is damaged and forced open. The door was damaged by E.S.U. personnel to gain entry. The west garage door is completely open. A 2009 silver four door BMW sedan bearing CT Registration 593XGR is parked in the west side of the garage. The front door of residence is located on the west side of the house facing Yogananda Street. The door is damaged. The deadbolt was engaged and broken open by E.S.U. Along the eastside or the rear of the residence is a wooden deck attached to the house. There is an exterior glass door that leads into the kitchen. The door is locked.

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There is an exterior door that leads to the north living room. The door is damaged. The deadbolt is engaged and broken open by E.S.U. Located on the south end of the residence is an open steel bulk head door. Inside the bulk head door is a wooden exterior door that leads into the basement. The deadbolt is engaged and broken open by E.S.U.

ATTACHED GARAGE



The 2009 BMW sedan is parked unoccupied in the west side bay of the garage. The east side of the garage is clear for a second vehicle to be stored. There is a small stack of firewood, a portable generator, several ladders and chairs are observed in the garage. Several bags of empty plastic water bottles are observed in the garage. The rest of the garage is unremarkable. There are wooden stairs and a landing in the south end of the garage leading to an exterior door. There are approximately a dozen pairs of shoes stored on the landing. The wooden door leads to a mudroom off of the kitchen in the residence. The door handle is locked and the door and frame are damaged from the E.S.U. forced entry. This writer entered the residence through the garage.


MUDROOM/ENTRYWAY

As I entered from the garage the mudroom has a ceramic tile floor. Directly ahead (south) is a closet. The closet contains coats, shoes and various boxes. There is a Nike shoebox located on the shelf. The box contains numerous .22 caliber bullets and (2) empty "Ram Line" magazines for a Ruger 10-22 firearm. A tan colored bag containing personal hygiene items, ear protection and plastic zip-loc bags with numerous "Blazer" .45 caliber live rounds is located on the closet floor.

KITCHEN

The kitchen is located east of the mudroom/entryway. The kitchen has wooden floors. Three brown paper shopping bags, a case of (24) plastic bottles of Poland Springs Water and a woman's Coach brand pocketbook are located on the kitchen floor within three feet of the garage entry door. To the right of the shopping bags is a "Captain Morgan" cardboard box which contains five bottles of wine. Inside the pocketbook are personal papers, \$130.00 in U.S. currency, a day planner appointment book and identification belonging to Nancy J. Lanza DOB [REDACTED]-1960. Along the east wall of the kitchen is a glass French-style door to the exterior rear deck. The north portion of the door is a fixed glass pane. There is clear tape covering the right edge of the door (along the opening) and the edge along the threshold. The door is locked. There is a kitchen table with four chairs near the door. A counter that also houses the kitchen sink runs along the east wall of the kitchen. There are dishes in the sink. A coffee maker is observed on the counter. It is clean, empty and unplugged. An automatic dishwasher is housed in beneath the east counter top. The indicator light on the dishwasher labeled: "sanitized and clean" is illuminated. The cabinet door below the kitchen sink is completely open. A small trash can containing garbage is on the kitchen floor directly in front of the open cabinet door. The counter continues around the south wall of the kitchen and houses a stove/oven, microwave oven and refrigerator. There is an island with a sink and two "bar stool" type chairs in the center of the kitchen. Numerous bottles of medication are located in the overhead cabinet along the east wall south of the sink. The following medications and supplements are noted: [REDACTED]

NORTH LIVING ROOM

The north living room is north of the kitchen. The floor is covered with blue carpet. There is a fireplace on the north wall. There are two couches, two ottomans as well as book shelves located in the room. A flat screen television on top of a small television stand is located along the west wall. There is a DVR system next to the television. A plastic "Bed Bath and Beyond" shopping bag containing various shopping items is located on the floor near the couch. A black Apple iphone is located on the ottoman closest to the kitchen. Along the east wall is another "french-style" door that leads to the exterior rear deck. The northern most door is a fixed glass pane. The swinging door and frame is broken open by E.S.U. Heavy curtains are pulled shut over the door and window pane blocking outdoor light. There is a large window on each side of the fireplace. Each window is covered with full length decorative mirrors blocking outdoor light. There is a stationary bicycle exercise machine and a pilates exercise bench in the room. There are book shelves which include books titled: "Look me in the Eye- My life with Aspergers", "Born on a Blue Day- Inside the Mind of an Autistic Savant and "NRA Guide to the Basics of Pistol Shooting".

SOUTH LIVING ROOM/DINING ROOM



Located south of the kitchen is a large open room with a wooden floor. The entire south end of the first floor is the south living room and dining room. The east end is the dining room. The west end is the south living room. The dining room has a wooden dining table and four chairs. The windows on the east wall (the rear of the house) are covered with thick drapes. There are four cardboard boxes stacked in the dining room. There are three empty "Cat's Pride" cat litter jugs with no labels on the dining room floor. The windows on the south wall have thick drapes but the drapes are open. The south living room has a love seat, two upholstered chairs, a coffee table and decorative shelves. The windows on the south wall have thick drapes. The drapes are open. The west wall windows (the front of the house) are covered with closed thick drapes.

FOYER

There is a foyer that runs west to east from the front door of the residence to the kitchen. There is an open staircase leading to the second floor of the residence. The floor of the foyer is ceramic tile. Traveling east from the front door a study/office is located on the left. There is a hall closet and a half bath on the left side heading towards the kitchen. There is nothing remarkable noted in the bathroom.

STUDY/OFFICE

There is a set of glass "French-style" doors leading into the study/office. The doors are both completely open. The study/office has a desk and chair on the north wall. There are book shelves on the north wall on each side of the desk. The shelves hold numerous books and knick knacks. Along the west wall (the front of the house) are two windows that are covered by closed thick drapes. There is a small table along the west wall with a telephone and answering machine on it. The machine indicates that the telephone has received (50) "new calls" and has (42)

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messages. There is a Dell lap-top computer on the desk. A Fax machine is located on a small table along the east wall. There is a leather easy chair along the east wall. The floor is wooden and is covered with an oriental style rug. There are papers stacked neatly on the floor next to the desk. Numerous receipts and invoices are located in the study/office. There are various financial papers, telephone bills and \$250.00 in U.S. currency in the desk drawers. Paperwork from the Connecticut Gun Exchange describing a Glock 20SF 10mm dated 12-21-2011 is located in the top desk drawer. Several receipts are located on the desk top. There are receipts from businesses in North Conway, NH dated 12-12-2012 and Lebanon, NH dated 12-13-2012. A cardboard box is located on the floor next to the leather chair. A blue folder labeled: "Guns" containing various receipts, papers and a "Sale and Transfer of all Firearms" form and related firearm paperwork is located in the box.


SECOND FLOOR

The staircase in the foyer leads to the second floor sleeping area. At the top of the stairs is a common hallway that overlooks the foyer/front door area. The second floor consists of four bedrooms and two full bathrooms.

SOUTHWEST BEDROOM/COMPUTER ROOM

The room is located in the southwest portion of the second floor. The room is carpeted. There is a live, brass colored, small caliber round with a black tip on the floor just inside the doorway. There are two desks along the west wall. The two windows on the west wall are covered with drawn window shades. The edges of the window shades are taped to the wall with clear adhesive tape. On top of the northern most desk is a damaged computer hard drive. Next to the hard drive is a black metal five pound dumbbell weight. The hard drive looks like it has been intentionally scratched repeatedly. There are three small keys next to the hard drive. There is an empty package of "Peltor" brand disposable foam earplugs and a black plastic comb next to the hard drive. Boxes of 9mm ammunition and high capacity firearm magazines containing shotgun shells are in the top right drawer of the desk. The bottom right drawer contains pieces of disassembled shotgun rounds and black powder. There are (13) pages of a photocopied newspaper article. The article describes the 1891 shooting of school children. There is a hard cover copy of the book: "Amish Grace" also located in the drawer. There is a custom built desk top computer in a black case with the side panels removed on the floor near the desk. There is no hard drive in the computer. There are screws and a screw driver on the floor next to the computer. In the southwest corner of the room is a set of headphones, computer speakers, computer mouse and keyboard. Along the south wall are small tables and cabinets with a computer monitor, television set and two empty eating bowls with spoons. There are two partially consumed Poland Springs water bottles on the desk. The cabinets along the south wall also contain a Sony Playstation 2 Game console and a Microsoft Xbox Game console. There is a closet located along the east wall of the room. The doors are open. In the closet is a stand alone metal gun safe. The door of the safe is open. An "Enfield" Albion bolt action .303 caliber rifle is in the gun safe. The safe also contains numerous items to include boxes and cans of ammunition. The ammunition includes: 12 gauge buck shot and slug shot gun shells, .22, .40 and .45 caliber rounds, .303 rifle cartridges, .223 rounds, .22 long rifle rounds, 5.56mm rounds, a leather dual magazine holder and a black leather handgun holster. There are metal shelves in the closet above the safe. There is more ammunition and two (20) round shot gun shell drums on the shelves.

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SOUTHEAST BEDROOM

The room is located in the southeast portion of the second floor. The door to the room is damaged. It appears that someone had kicked the bottom of the door causing the damage. All three of the windows in the room are completely covered with black plastic. There is a double bed on the east wall. Along the north wall is an armoire that contains approximately a dozen pairs of tan colored cargo style pants and blue shirts. Along the west wall is a closet that is used for storage. There are two desktop computers and three computer monitors. The computers do not have hard drives. There are several boxes of books in the closet. Some of the book topics were war, practical shooting and competitive firearm shooting. There were boxes that also contained videogames. There were several exercise dumbbells to include a black metal five pound dumbbells similar to the one found in the southwest bedroom/computer room. There is a plastic bag containing items to include: 2010 Honda Civic paperwork registered to Nancy Lanza, Verbatim CD-Rs, handwritten notes regarding addresses of local gun shops and a Garmin GPS Unit.

SECOND FLOOR FULL BATHROOM



There is a bathroom located on the east side of the second floor common hallway. The bathroom has two sinks and a toilet along the north wall. There are cabinets below the sinks. Various toiletry items are located in the cabinets. Personal items that include a silver colored LG Verizon cellular telephone with the battery removed, pocket change, a men's wallet containing Adam Lanza's credit cards, driver's license and \$63.00 in cash, a "Newtown Technology Team" picture ID with Adam Lanza printed on it, two pairs of eye glasses, a Honda car key and a black "Mead Memo" pad were located in the western most cabinet closest to the door. There is a tub and shower located along the south wall.

NORTHEAST STORAGE/BEDROOM

The room is located in the northeast portion of the second floor. The room is very cluttered and appears to be utilized for storage. From the hallway three long gun cases are observed on the floor of the room. The gun cases are empty. An empty plastic Sig Sauer hand gun case and an empty plastic Glock hand gun case are also on the floor of the room. The room is cluttered with full cardboard moving boxes and bags. There is a closet located along the west wall that contains adult women's clothing. A blue and white duffle bag is located on the floor. The bag contains numerous items to include: a full box of "Blazer .22 long rifle rounds, ear protection, eye protection, binoculars, a box of "PPU" 303 British cartridges, 9mm rounds, numerous paper targets and Adam Lanza's NRA certificate.

MASTER BEDROOM

The master bedroom is located in the northwest portion of the second floor. There is a key lock mechanism on the door. The lock and door are not damaged. There is a private hallway traveling south to north from the common hallway to the master bedroom. There is a master bathroom and a walk-in closet on the west side of the private hallway. The master bath contains a toilet and a Jacuzzi tub. Women's laundry on a drying rack is observed in the Jacuzzi tub. There is a counter with two sinks along the master bathroom south wall. Numerous medications and supplements are observed in the master bathroom to include: [REDACTED]

The walk-in closet is located north of the master bed room bath. The closet contains what appears to be all women's clothing and shoes. There is a two drawer filing cabinet on the floor to the right of the closet door. The cabinet contains various papers to include medical bills, handwritten papers, children's artwork and telephone bills. A hand drawn drawing depicting a person with a handgun labeled "Sadam" with another person on the floor with "X" for eyes is located inside a box underneath clothing.



North of the closet is the master bedroom sleeping area. A king sized bed is located with the headboard against the east wall. An adult white female is observed lying supine on the bed with obvious trauma to the head. On the floor south of the bed is a black Savage Arms .22 caliber bolt action rifle. There is a spent .22 caliber shell casing on the floor next to the rifle [REDACTED] Subsequently a firearm survey was conducted and a spent .22 caliber shell casing was located in the chamber and three live rounds were in the magazine. A pair of black women's slippers and white Hanes socks are on the floor south of the bed. There is a nightstand located south of the bed on the east wall. On top of the night stand is a telephone. The telephone line is unplugged from the telephone. The line is neatly placed next to the telephone. There is a pair of eye glasses, a plastic water bottle and a lamp on the nightstand. [REDACTED]

There is an ottoman south of the night stand. The Ottoman has a lid with a storage area. Numerous papers to include paperwork documenting Nancy Lanza's divorce are located inside the ottoman. A brass colored .22 caliber spent shell casing is located behind the ottoman next to the east wall. A brass colored .22 caliber spent shell casing is located underneath the bed near the east wall. There is a second nightstand along the east wall north of the bed. Located in the nightstand are numerous papers to include emails and receipts for firearm and ammunition purchases, as well as numerous day planners. There is a desk located along the west wall. The desk contains financial paperwork to include, bills, cancelled checks and personal papers. There are several pieces of luggage located on the floor in the southwest corner of the master bedroom. The luggage contains what appears to be dirty laundry in plastic bags.

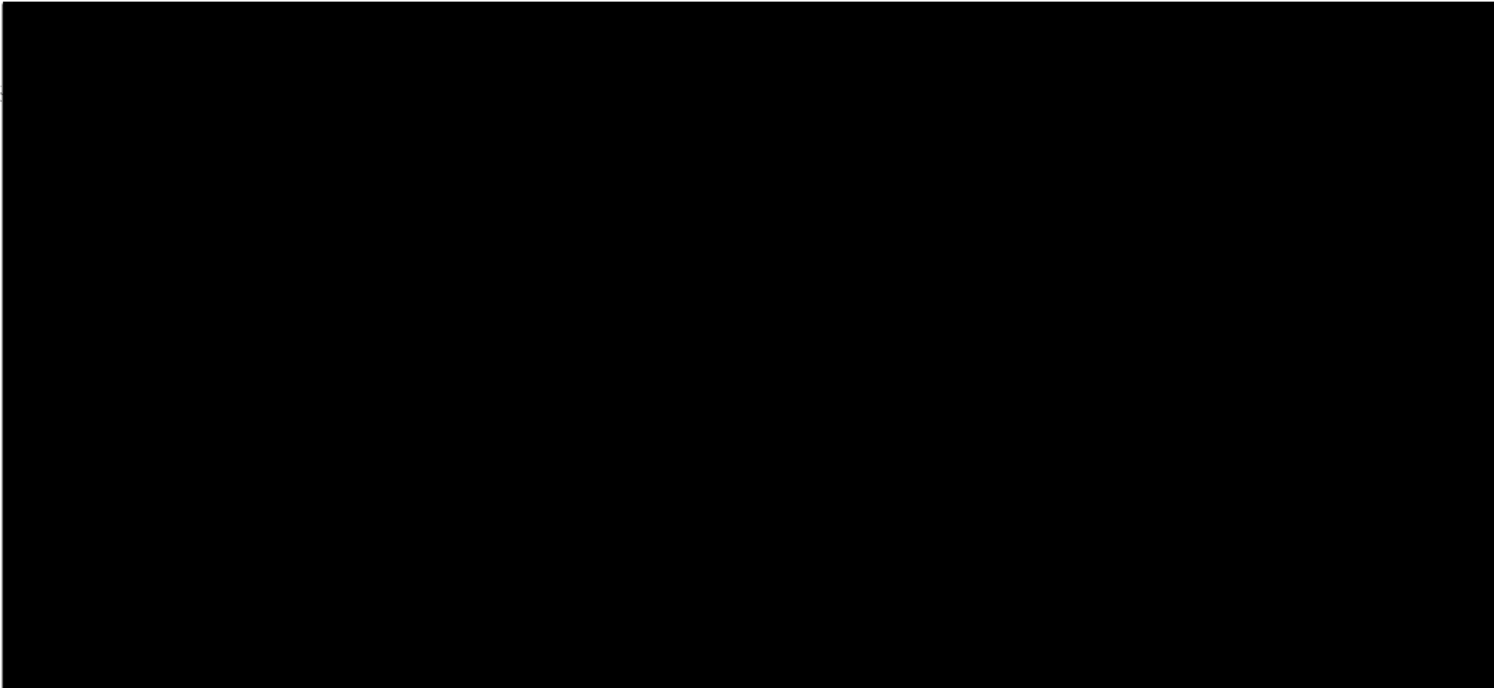
BASEMENT



The basement of the residence is divided into four separate rooms. In the west end of the basement is a bedroom area. There is a double bed in the room. The bed is made. It does not appear that someone sleeps in the room on a regular basis. The room is cluttered with moving boxes. There are several empty cardboard boxes on top of the bed. There are empty cardboard boxes stacked near the bed. There is an armoire and an exterior door on the west


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wall. The exterior door deadbolt lock is engaged. The door and frame are damaged from E.S.U. forced entry. There are steps leading to an open metal bulk head door. There is a kitchen style table with chairs along the east wall of the bedroom. Boxes are stacked on top of the table. Beneath the table is a desk top computer on the floor. There is no hard drive in the computer. There is a desk located near the southwest corner of the basement. There are numerous video games, a computer modem and a wireless router observed. Also on the desk is an Xbox videogame console. The game is not plugged in or connected to any other device. There are shelves and a counter east of the desk. There are cabinets beneath the counter. There is a Nintendo game console on the counter. The game is unplugged and not connected to any other device. A computer hard drive is located on the floor near the cabinets along with game controllers and wires. There is a closet beneath the stairs in the bedroom area of the basement. The closet contains numerous items to include martial arts weapons, board games, boxes and used paper shooting targets. Various pieces of paperwork with name Ryan Lanza is located in the bedroom area of the basement. There is a used cardboard shooting target located behind the couch near the exterior door. A digital image print of an unknown child and various firearms is located in the cabinets below the shelves. The image appears to have been printed from a computer type printer. There is a finished area east of the bedroom that houses exercise equipment and various boxes. There is a small bathroom with a toilet located off of the exercise equipment room. There is an unfinished utility area located in the southeast corner of the basement. There are numerous boxes stored in the utility area. There are two clothes washers and a dryer located in a separate utility area located in the north east corner of the basement. A small room with a shower is located near the washer and dryer utility room.



Action Taken: On Friday December 14, 2012, between 2130 hours and 0845 hours the following four hundred and seventy two (472) digital images were taken as part of a homicide investigation being conducted in the town of Sandyhook, Connecticut by members of the Connecticut State Police, Eastern District Major Crime Squad.

The images attached depict 36 Yogananda Street, the residence of Nancy Lanza and her son Adam Lanza. The digital images were taken by Detective Daniel Cargill #550 of the Connecticut State Police Eastern District Major Crime Squad utilizing a Nikon D-300 digital camera and stored on a Verbatim 8GB SD card. The digital color images were taken from various angles and directions showing various the views of the residence and its contents.

The images were subsequently transferred to a "Memorex" DVD-R disc which is being held at the Connecticut State Police Eastern District Major Crime Squad Headquarters located at #401 W. Thames Street Unit #500 Norwich, CT. Copies of the DVD-R will be made as necessary for casebooks and reports as needed. The images were captured under the authority of a search and seizure warrant signed on 12/14/2012 by members of the Connecticut State Police Central District Major Crime Squad.


Review of Electronic Evidence

On August 2, 2013 members of the Western District Major Crime Squad (WDMCS) received a Western Digital 320GB hard drive bearing serial number 000001D919A0 from the FBI. This drive contained forensic image files of certain pieces of electronic evidence seized from 36 Yogananda Street in Newtown, CT by members of the Connecticut State Police (CSP) pursuant to a search and seizure warrant. The CSP exhibits had been turned over to the FBI where the contents of each item were forensically imaged onto the Western Digital hard drive for further examination and analysis. This hard drive was then placed into an I/O Magic USB Enclosure to allow the imaged files to be viewed. Contained on the Western Digital drive are six (6) forensic image files that correspond with six CSP exhibits.

This Western Digital hard drive was assigned exhibit number 374 under case number CFS-12-00704559. Five of the six forensic image files were reviewed by members of the Western District Major Crime Squad at the request of State's Attorney Stephen Sedensky to determine if there were any items of evidentiary value located in them. The results of that review are detailed in the attached PDF document titled "Review of Electronic Evidence." The Western Digital drive was then submitted to the Connecticut State Police Forensic Science Laboratory Computer Crimes & Electronic Evidence section because the remaining forensic image file was unable to be viewed using the equipment/software available to WDMCS detectives. A separate report detailing the findings from the examination of that image file will be forthcoming from the Computer Crimes & Electronic Evidence section.

ACTION TAKEN:

On 08/16/13, I was assigned to review documents returned from the FBI-Behavioral Analysis Unit. A review of box #3 of 5 boxes revealed a spiral bound booklet called "The Big Book of Granny", which appeared to be created by the shooter and [REDACTED]. The book is bound in a black plastic spiral binding and covered on the front and back with a clear plastic sheeting. The book starts with a list of 85 Granny Jokes. All of the jokes are degrading statements beginning with "Granny!....."

Following 3 pages of Granny Jokes, the book lists "Granny Products of the Future", which includes advertisements for Granny Action Figure, Granny Action Figure 2, Granny Action Figure 3, Granny Action Figure 4, Granny Action Figure 5, Granny Action Figure Set (includes all 5 Granny Action Figures), Gran Spam, Granny Oats and Granny's Granny. Each of the products is described in an advertisement format with monetary cost and phone number to call to order.

The next section of the book is labeled as "Granny's Clubhouse of Happy Children." This section is a typed dialog from an imaginary TV show. The main characters feature Granny, her son "Bobolicious" and several children. In the show, Granny and Bobolicious are talking to the group of children as if in a group. In the first episode, Granny punches one boy in the face, throws a match and causes an explosion and threatens to shoot and kill the children. The second episode, Granny's Clubhouse of Happy Children 2, starts out with Bobolicious speaking to the children. Bobolicious said "Hi! I'm Bobolicious the Explorer.... Remember last time when everyone was slaughtered!?! Well...You bread-brain leeches gave me 75 years of prison for that so called "Tragedy"! I was having fun!" The third and final episode, Granny's Clubhouse of Happy Children 3, introduces two new characters, Dora the Beserker and her monkey, Shoes. Bobolicious says that they are going to play a game of "Hide and go Die."

The next section of the book is labeled "Adventures of Granny." There are eight chapters labeled "The Adventures of Granny" through "The Adventures of Granny 8." All eight chapters are dialog between Granny and another character identified as Granny's Son with various persons added in. In the first chapter, Granny and Granny's Son rob a bank, Granny shoots people with her rifle cane, and then blows up the bank with dynamite. After the robbery, Granny's Son shoots Granny in the head with a shotgun. In the second chapter, Granny and Granny's Son go on a boat ride. Granny falls out of the boat and Granny's Son throws her a cement floatation device which forces her to sink to the bottom of the ocean. In the third chapter, Granny and Granny's Son try to capture a boy and stuff him, to put on the mantle. Granny kicks the boy into the fireplace and he begins to burn. The boy jumps out of the fire and Granny punches him in the face. Then Granny shoots at him three times with her rifle cane and misses him. Granny then throws a Granny Action Figure to the boy. The boy gets distracted and the action figure comes alive and shoots the boy. Granny's Son says "Yay! Now we can hang it!" In chapter four, Granny and Granny's Son go to a hockey game. Granny goes onto the ice and punches one of the players and then shoots him with her rifle cane. After the hockey game, Granny and Granny's Son go to Duchess restaurant to eat. In chapter five, Granny goes to Marine boot camp and meets up with Dora the Beserker and Swiper the Raccoon. Granny asks Dora if she would assassinate a soldier at midnight and Dora agrees to do it. Dora says " I like hurting people...Especially children..." Granny then shoots multiple people with her rifle cane. When Granny escapes boot camp and goes home to Granny's Son, she tells him that she left boot camp because she killed the entire Marine legion. In chapter six, Granny and Granny's Son are picked up from the side of the road by Dora the Beserker. Dora tells Granny that she can take her wherever she needs to go, after they go to the daycare center. When they arrive at the daycare center, Dora sends Swiper the Raccoon inside to distract the children. Then Dora enters and says "Let's hurt children." In chapter seven, Granny and Granny's Son go to visit Dora the Beserker. Dora takes them on an adventure to find Drunk. In the adventure, they encounter a rooster and have to call upon their bag to get a shotgun. In their bag is a handgun, AK-47, M-16, rifle, rocket launcher, musket and a shotgun. Dora uses the shotgun to shoot the rooster and Swiper the Raccoon. Later in the adventure, Dora accidentally shoots her monkey, named Shoes, Lenny the Cow and Tico the Chipmunk. Dora eventually gets arrested for possession of 6 guns and murdering 4 animals. In chapter 8, Granny and Granny's Son use a time machine to go back in time. In their travels, they meet The Beatles. Granny kills all of The Beatles and says that she kills every bug she sees. Granny and Granny's Son get arrested and sentenced to 75 years in jail for killing The Beatles. 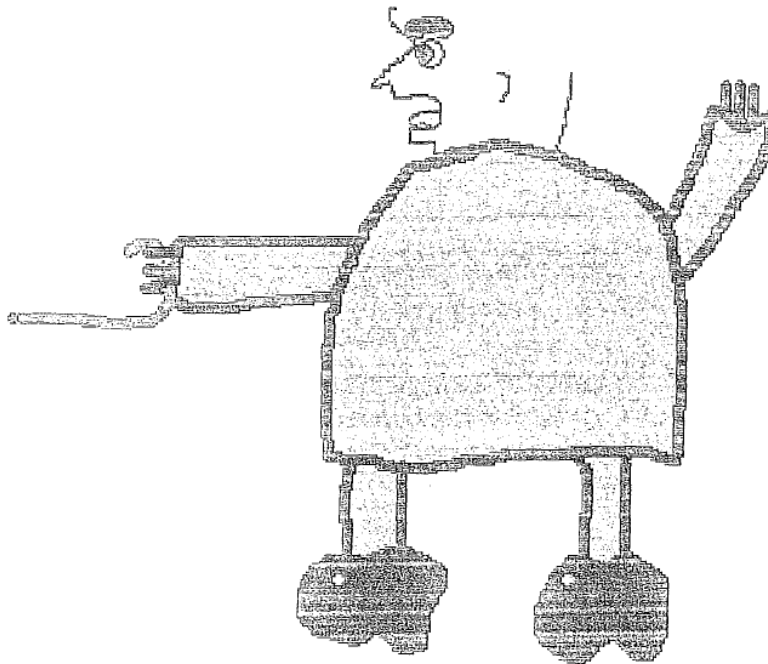

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT: EXAMINATION OF GPS (GARMIN NUVI 200)

I was tasked with examining the GPS (Garmin Nuvi 200) unit seized from the residence of 36 Yogananda St. The GPS was originally seized via search warrant by the Eastern District Major Crime Squad (EDMC). The EDMC turned the GPS (Item #58 seized under case # 12-00705354) over to the FBI for extraction. Special Agent Rovelli extracted the information into a readable source and that information was provided to me. I burned the information onto a CD-R and labeled it as State Police exhibit #343 under case number 12-00704559.

On 02/14/2013, at approximately 1647 hours, I contacted Garmin and spoke with Customer Service Representative Rachele (ph.). Rachele explained that the Garmin Nuvi 200 obtains its time via satellite and cannot be manipulated by an individual. Therefore, the times depicted throughout this report represent an accurate time stamp.

The following information was gleaned from the "journey" entries within the extraction report. The information taken from the "journey" is specific to latitude and longitude which I applied to Bing maps for locations. (See attached CD of journeys and maps). In applying the latitude and longitude into Bing maps, I inserted a location for every 2 minutes. Areas of interest, specifically school locations throughout Newtown that the GPS had a close proximity to, I checked every latitude and longitude in that specific time frame to ensure the GPS did not enter the schools.

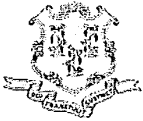
